We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the
following entitled BILL:
S. B. No. 3146: Appropriation; Mississippi Development Authority.
We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Plan to ensure that all full-time employees receive a pay increase

26 equal to fifty percent (50%) of the realignment component of the 27 Variable Compensation Plan or Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00), 28 whichever is greater, beginning on January 1, 2003.

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 29 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 30 31 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2004 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2003 32 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs, positions or 33 pay increases are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi 34 35 Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall, on July 1, 2002, publish 36 separate annual projection reports, based on July 1, 2002 data, 37 for the period of July 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002, and 38 January 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003, that project the annual 39 cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with 40 the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 41 42 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this projected cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2003 appropriation for 43 "Personal Services," as annualized on a semi-annual basis in 44 accordance with the provisions of this act. If, at the end of any 45 calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the 46 47 agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal 48 Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 49 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce 50 the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement 51 52 will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 53

54 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 55 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

60 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the 61 amount of Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) shall

be provided from the Motor Carrier Regulation Account to defray 62 63 the expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority in operating 64 the state welcome centers.

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 65 Section 2, One Million Nine Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand Four 66 Hundred Six Dollars (\$1,928,406.00) shall be derived from the 67 Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi 68 Code of 1972. 69

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 70 Section 2, Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) shall be derived 71 from the Mississippi Department of Transportation and is allocated 72 in this act as follows: 73

SECTION 7. The acceptance and expenditure of funds, and interest on such funds, received from, or by virtue of consent or 82 other orders of or agreements involving any agency, 83

instrumentality, or judicial tribunal of any state or the United 84 85 States for petroleum price compliance and allocation which may become available during the fiscal year for the support of the 86 Mississippi Development Authority or any programs sponsored under 87 88 the terms of the receipt of these funds are hereby authorized not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) and approved, 89 provided such receipts and expenditures are reported and otherwise 90 accounted for in accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq., and 91 Section 27-104-1 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972. 92

93 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Development Authority is hereby authorized to 94 escalate, budget and expend funds from any source not to exceed 95 Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) in accordance with rules and 96 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a 97

98 manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

99 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Development Authority shall maintain complete 100 101 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 102 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 103 Year 2002. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 104 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2004 shall be 105 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 106 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 107 108 provided during the Fiscal Year 2003 budget request process.

SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, the amount of Six Million Four Hundred Sixty-two Thousand Dollars (\$6,462,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is provided for the purpose of supporting Mississippi Tourism Advertising and Promotion for Fiscal Year 2003. The expenditure of funds authorized in this section shall be exempt from Section 25-9-120, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, the amount of One Million Five Hundred Sixty-seven Thousand Dollars (\$1,567,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is provided for the purpose of supporting, marketing, and facilitating Mississippi business growth for Fiscal Year 2003. The expenditure of funds authorized in this section shall be exempt from Section 25-9-120, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 12. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

In addition to all other sums herein 164 165 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 166 167 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi 168 Development Authority for the purpose of providing funds for

169 Mississippi Technology Alliance, for the fiscal year beginning

170 July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003

.....\$ 1,333,670.00. 171 172 The funds appropriated under the provisions of this section 173 are provided for the specific purpose of providing state funds for support of Mississippi Technology Alliance to strengthen the 174 175 business environment in Mississippi to spur the creation and growth of technology-based industries, thus creating many more 176 high-paying jobs and a more diversified, competitive Mississippi 177 economy. The funds herein appropriated shall be held separate and 178 179 apart from all other funds appropriated to the Mississippi 180 Development Authority.

SECTION 14. In addition to all other sums herein 181 182 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 183 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi 184 Development Authority for the purpose of providing funds to 185 186 support the Stennis Space Center - Space Commerce 187 Initiative, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending 188 June 30, 2003.....\$ 1,234,880.00.

189 The funds herein appropriated shall be held separate and 190 apart from all other funds appropriated to the Mississippi 191 Development Authority. As a condition for the expenditure of funds appropriated in this Section, the Mississippi Space Commerce 192 193 Initiative (MSCI) shall prepare a plan that sets out the MSCI 194 mission and identifies the methodology through which MSCI will interface with other Mississippi agencies, institutions and 195 196 federal agencies. This plan shall be presented to the Chairmen of the Appropriations Committees of the Senate and House of 197 Representatives on or before October 1, 2002. 198

SECTION 15. In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any special source funds not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of providing funds to support the Stennis Space Center - Space Commerce Initiative, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003\$ 4,000,000.00.

SECTION 16. None of the funds appropriated in Section 2 206 shall be expended unless members of the Mississippi House of 207 Representatives and Mississippi Senate representing such districts 208 209 are notified at least ten (10) days prior to the awarding of 210 Community Development Block Grants or any other grants to their 211 districts.

212 SECTION 17. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 213 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 214 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 215 216 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 217 SECTION 18. This act shall take effect and be in force from 218 and after July 1, 2002. 219
