## **REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

## MADAM PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S. B. No. 3163: Appropriation; Dept. of Corrections - Support and Reimb. Local Confinement.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.

2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:

## Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 136 137 Services" for Fiscal Year 2004 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2003 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs, positions or 138 139 pay increases are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget 140 Office, the State Personnel Board shall, on July 1, 2002, publish 141 separate annual projection reports, based on July 1, 2002 data, 142 for the period of July 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002, and 143 January 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003, that project the annual 144 cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with 145 146 the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 147 148 this projected cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2003 appropriation for "Personal Services," as annualized on a semi-annual basis in 149 accordance with the provisions of this act. If, at the end of any 150 calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the 151 152 agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed 153 this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 154 155 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement 156 157 will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 158

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law, except that no transfers shall be made which reduce funds allocated in Section 3 to Regional Facilities or Private Prisons.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

167 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 168 Department of Corrections may use any federal funds that may 169 become available for the construction of a certified fail-safe 170 lethal/non-lethal fencing system at any of its maximum security 171 units for that purpose.

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 172 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, it is the intention 173 of the Legislature that any contractual service payments made by 174 175 the department to defray medical expenses for inmates shall be at the currently established Medicaid reimbursement rate; however, if 176 177 hospital and medical providers will not contract at the Medicaid reimbursement rate, the Department of Corrections may enter into a 178 179 negotiated contract.

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 180 181 none shall be expended for personnel housing under the 182 jurisdiction of the Department of Corrections unless the department shall collect a reasonable rent, after a finding of 183 fact as to what is a reasonable rent, and/or the cost of utilities 184 furnished to said housing, except that the Superintendent of the 185 Central Mississippi Correctional Facility may be provided with a 186 housing expense allowance in lieu of being furnished with a 187 188 dwelling house. The Department of Corrections shall not pay for 189 the installation or monthly service of any telephone installed in a staff residence under its jurisdiction. 190

SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, payment may be authorized for court ordered attorney fees and any accrued interest subject to the approval of the Office of the Attorney General.

196 **SECTION 8.** No part of the funds herein appropriated shall be 197 used for the purpose of returning escaped state convicts to the 198 State Penitentiary from a distance of over one hundred (100) miles 199 beyond the borders of the state, except upon approval of the 200 Governor in each specific case.

SECTION 9. None of the money herein appropriated shall be paid to any person who by the provision of Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, is prohibited from being an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections. The State Department of Finance and Administration shall at least annually make a report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance Evaluation and Expenditure Review and to the Attorney General

stating the name of any person prohibited under the provisions of 208 Section 47-5-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, from being 209 an employee of the Mississippi Department of Corrections who has 210 211 during the preceding year received any money herein appropriated. In the event that any such person prohibited as herein above 212 213 provided from receiving funds herein appropriated should receive any of said funds, the Attorney General shall immediately commence 214 action to recover the monies so paid to said person and to enjoin 215 the further employment of said person at the Mississippi 216 Department of Corrections. 217

SECTION 10. It is the intent of the Legislature that all prisoners at Parchman shall work a minimum of eight (8) hours per day, excluding prisoners with a physical disability or those incarcerated in maximum security.

SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2004.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Corrections shall have the authority to accept, budget and expend any special funds collected or otherwise available, through the sell of scrap or recycled material, for the purpose of providing recycling equipment, supplies or services for use within the department.

269 **SECTION 13.** None of the funds appropriated herein can be 270 directly or indirectly associated with the ACA accreditation in 271 the Community Services Division.

SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Joint Legislative Committee on Performance Evaluation and Expenditure Review (PEER) conduct a cost analysis to determine the necessary per diem, per inmate cost (including debt service costs) at all regional facilities. Furthermore, it is the intention of the Legislature that a breakeven point be established for each facility.

**SECTION 15.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions

of Section 2, Two Million Twenty Thousand Seven Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$2,020,711.00) shall be derived from the Budget Contingency Fund created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, with One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,300,000.00) to be used for the George County Correctional Facility.

**SECTION 16.** In addition to all other sums herein appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of paying the expenses of counties for holding state prisoners in county jails, for the period beginning July 1, 2002, and ending June 30, 2003...... \$ 3,990,914.00.

SECTION 17. In addition to all other sums herein 293 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 294 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Budget 295 296 Contingency Fund, created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code 297 of 1972, to the Department of Corrections for the purpose of paying the expenses of counties for holding state prisoners in 298 299 county jails, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, and 300 ending June 30, 2003.....\$ 48,335.00.

SECTION 18. In addition to all other sums heretofore 301 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 302 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the Budget 303 304 Contingency Fund, created in Section 27-103-301, Mississippi Code of 1972, to the Mississippi Department of Corrections for the 305 306 purpose of paying the costs for providing medical services to state inmates and for paying the expenses of counties for holding 307 state prisoners in county jails, for the fiscal year ending 308 309 June 30, 2002.....\$ 15,100,000.00.

This additional appropriation is made for the purpose of preventing a deficit which would otherwise occur. The funds appropriated under the provisions of this Section shall be allocated as follows:

Total.....\$ 15,100,000.00 316 317 **SECTION 19.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 318 319 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 320 321 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 322 SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from 323 and after July 1, 2002, except for Section 18, which shall take 324 325 effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
