Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- SECTION 1. Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 14 reenacted as follows: 15 It is hereby found and determined by the 16 17 Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi 18 veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve 19 for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument 20 should be established and maintained as a symbol of the 21 22 recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to 23 Mississippi veterans. SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 2.4 25 reenacted as follows: 55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws, 2.6 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership 27
- of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease
- serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of 29
- Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi 30
- Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven 31
- 32 (7) members:

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33 The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans

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34 Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the
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- 35 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission;
- 36 (b) The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans
- 37 Affairs Board;
- 38 (c) The Director of the Division of General Services in
- 39 the Department of Finance and Administration;
- 40 (d) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one
- 41 (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as
- 42 follows:
- (i) One (1) veteran of World War II;
- 44 (ii) One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and
- 45 (iii) One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict;
- 46 (e) One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict,
- 47 appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor.
- 48 (2) The initial meeting of the commission shall be called
- 49 and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans
- 50 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a
- 51 chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission
- 52 shall elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at
- 53 the call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings
- of the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along
- 55 with all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of
- 56 the secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission
- 57 shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All
- 58 actions taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission
- 59 shall be by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea
- and nay votes of each member present. The signature of the
- 61 chairman and secretary, pursuant to a duly adopted resolution,
- 62 shall be binding upon the commission.
- 63 (3) The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans
- 64 Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the
- 65 amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for each day or portion
- 66 thereof spent in the performance of the duties of the commission
- 67 and shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses while
- on commission business as authorized under Section 25-3-41. Other

- 69 members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation
- 70 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as
- 71 authorized under Section 25-3-41 while on commission business.
- 72 Commission members shall be limited to reimbursement of travel
- 73 expenses and per diem compensation authorized herein for no more
- 74 than twelve (12) meetings per year.
- 75 (4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
- 76 to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
- 77 Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
- 78 Veterans Memorial Commission.
- 79 (5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
- 80 have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
- 81 pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.
- 82 (6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall
- 83 continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after
- 84 the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi
- 85 veterans monument for a period of one (1) year after the date on
- 86 which the Mississippi veterans monument is officially dedicated so
- 87 that such commission can provide for the design, construction and
- 88 dedication of future monuments to be located at sites designated
- 89 by the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission.
- 90 **SECTION 3.** Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 91 reenacted as follows:
- 92 55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is
- 93 hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and
- 94 maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans
- 95 when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in
- 96 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created.
- 97 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 98 reenacted as follows:
- 99 55-15-57. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission
- 100 shall:
- 101 (a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and
- 102 dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual
- 103 design and site of the monument shall be selected with the

- 104 approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.
- 105 (b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into
- 106 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund.
- 107 (c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each
- 108 year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report
- 109 required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an
- 110 annual report on its activities no later than November of each
- 111 year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi
- 112 House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate.
- SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 114 reenacted as follows:
- 115 55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is
- 116 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from
- 117 individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans
- 118 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury.
- 119 The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans
- 120 Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited
- 121 into the fund. All appropriated funds and funds deposited in the
- 122 Veterans Monument Trust Fund shall be used exclusively for the
- 123 purpose of designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the
- 124 veterans monument, except that not more than Seven Thousand Five
- 125 Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be expended annually to pay the
- 126 administrative costs of the commission. Costs associated with the
- 127 designing, erecting, maintaining and dedication of the veterans
- 128 monument are not considered commission administrative costs for
- 129 purposes of this section. Any monies remaining unexpended or
- 130 unencumbered in the fund upon completion of the monument shall
- 131 revert to the Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission for
- 132 maintenance of the veterans monument and memorials.
- SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 134 reenacted as follows:
- 135 55-15-61. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the
- 136 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55,
- 137 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission
- 138 shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication

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     Military Park. In planning the design, construction and
     dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and
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     be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3)
     representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of
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     Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of
     Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and
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     certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit
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     private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate
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     Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury.
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     Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state
     using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature;
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     however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty
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     Thousand Dollars ($150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission
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     is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund
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     grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds
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     deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the
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     purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument.
               The board of supervisors of any county and the governing
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     authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and
     empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any
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     available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the Shiloh
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     Confederate Memorial Trust Fund.
          SECTION 7. Section 55-15-62, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
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     reenacted as follows:
          55-15-62. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the
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     Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55,
     55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission is
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     hereby authorized, subject to any available funds, to plan and
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     provide for the design, construction and dedication of a monument
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     recognizing Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of
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             In planning the design, construction and dedication of the
     monument, the commission shall consult with and be advised by the
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     State Veterans Affairs Board. The commission may solicit private
     monetary donations for deposit into a Congressional Medal of Honor
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of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National

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- 174 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury.
- 175 Private donations to the trust fund may be accepted. The
- 176 commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust
- 177 fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. All
- 178 funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for
- 179 the purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the
- 180 monument.
- 181 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing
- 182 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and
- 183 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any
- 184 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the
- 185 Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund.
- 186 SECTION 8. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 187 amended as follows:
- 188 55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through 55-15-62, Mississippi
- 189 Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans
- 190 Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, 2003.
- 191 **SECTION 9.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 192 and after July 1, 2002.
