Adopted AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill NO. 859

By Senator(s) Committee

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

9 SECTION 1. Section 73-67-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:

(1) No person may advertise massage or practice 11 73-67-21. 12 massage for compensation in this state unless he is registered as a massage therapist by the board. No person may use the title of 13 or represent himself to be a massage therapist or use any other 14 title, abbreviations, letters, figures, signs or devices that 15 indicate that such person is a massage therapist unless he is 16 17 registered to practice massage therapy under the provisions of 18 this chapter. Massage establishments shall be exempt from the advertising provisions found in Section 73-67-29 provided that 19 such therapy or service is performed by person(s) registered under 20 21 this chapter.

(2) The following are requirements for registration:
(a) An applicant must be eighteen (18) years of age, or
older, on the date the application is submitted.
(b) An application must provide proof of high school
graduate equivalency.

27 (c) An applicant must be of legal status not only to28 receive a certificate of registration, but also to work in the

29 State of Mississippi with such certificate of registration.

30 (d) An applicant must supply proof of current
31 certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and first aid
32 of at least eight (8) hours of training, including practical
33 testing, and supply documentation of familiarity with The
34 Americans With Disabilities Act.

35 (e) All required fees for registration must be36 submitted by the applicant.

37 (f) Any and all requirements regarding good moral
38 character and competency, as provided for in this chapter and in
39 accepted codes of ethics, shall be met.

40 (g) An applicant must have completed an approved
41 continuing education course on communicable diseases, including
42 HIV/AIDS information and prevention.

The applicant's official and certified (h) 43 transcript(s) from the applicant's massage therapy school. 44 Such 45 transcript must verify that the applicant has completed a board-approved training program of no less than the minimum 46 requirement for supervised in-class massage therapy instruction 47 and student clinic, with a minimum grade requirement of "C" or 48 better in every course of instruction, as stated for school 49 50 requirements; or if the applicant is submitting criteria from an apprenticeship program, all required documentation, forms and 51 52 other board-stipulated requirements must be met.

53 (3) The following pre-act practitioners are exempt from 54 having to take any examination for registration, but must fulfill 55 all other requirements as stated in this chapter, except for the 56 requirements in subsection (2)(h) of this section:

57 (a) Those having more than three hundred (300)
58 documented, board-accepted in-class hours of massage therapy
59 education before January 1, 2001.

(b) Those having more than five (5) years of
professional massage therapy experience and a minimum of one
hundred fifty (150) hours of approved massage therapy education
<u>before January 1, 2001</u>.

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(c) Those having no formal training, but who have
successfully passed the National Certification Examination for
Therapeutic Massage and Bodywork.

67 All grandfathering exemption allowances as stated (d) in this section shall end on July 1, 2002, for nonstudents, and on 68 June 1, 2003, for students who were enrolled in a part-time 69 massage school curriculum on July 1, 2001. 70 Individuals may apply for a certificate of registration until the grandfathering 71 exemption ends, but may not practice massage beyond the allowed 72 grace period as provided for in Section 73-67-37 unless a valid 73 massage therapy certificate of registration or provisional permit 74 is obtained. All other pre-act practitioners and anyone not 75 76 practicing massage therapy before January 1, 2001, must take and pass the registration examination and follow the requirements in 77 78 this chapter to practice massage therapy for compensation in Mississippi. 79

80 (e) Students enrolled in a massage therapy curriculum 81 of at least five hundred (500) hours on July 1, 2001, who complete 82 graduation from the same curriculum.

83 **SECTION 2.** Section 73-67-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 84 amended as follows:

85 73-67-37. The grace period for certificates of registration to be issued shall be from the effective date of this act until 86 87 July 1, 2002. Those meeting the minimum requirements as stated in this chapter, except for obtaining a certificate of registration, 88 may continue the practice of massage therapy or instruction 89 90 thereof within the grace period. Massage curriculums that begin before July 1, 2001, may continue with the same curriculum until 91 completion. Anyone not meeting the minimum requirements as stated 92 in this chapter shall not advertise massage therapy or instruction 93 94 thereof until they meet the minimum requirements of this chapter. 95 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

96 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

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AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-67-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND FROM JANUARY 1, 2002, TO JULY 1, 2002, THE PERIOD OF TIME WITHIN WHICH MASSAGE THERAPISTS WHO ARE QUALIFIED UNDER THE GRANDFATHERING EXEMPTION MUST REGISTER IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MISSISSIPPI PROFESSIONAL MASSAGE THERAPY ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 73-67-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
