Lost AMENDMENT No. 1 TO AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

AMEND by inserting the following after line 757 and 1 2 renumbering accordingly: (5) From and after January 1, 2002, no chancellor or judge 3 of this state shall order any portion of the tobacco settlement 4 monies to be diverted or deposited into any account, person, 5 agency or corporation other than into the State Treasury to the 6 7 credit of the Health Care Expendable Fund established under this Section 43-13-407, and any such order which is not in compliance 8 with this subsection (5) is hereby abated and of no effect. 9 10 SECTION *. Section 27-103-103, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 11 12 27-103-103. (1) For the purpose of Sections 27-103-101 through 27-103-139 and 27-104-1 through 27-104-27, the term "state 13 general-fund agency" or "general-fund agency" shall mean any 14 agency, department, institution, board or commission of the State 15 of Mississippi which is supported in whole or in part by 16 appropriations from the General Fund; but such term shall not 17 include the Legislature. 18 (2) For the purposes of Sections 27-103-101 through 19 27-103-139 and 27-104-1 through 27-104-27, the term "state 20 special-fund agency" or "special-fund agency" shall mean any 21 agency, department, institution, board or commission of the State 22 of Mississippi which receives no appropriation from the General 23

Fund, but which is supported entirely from special fund sources, by appropriation, or otherwise, but such term shall not include the State Highway Department; nor shall such term include the Mississippi Industries for the Blind.

(3) For the purposes of Sections 27-103-101 through
27-103-139 and 27-104-1 through 27-104-27, the term "state agency"
30 shall mean any general fund agency or special fund agency as
31 defined in this section, or the State Highway Department, or the
32 Division of State Aid Road Construction of the State Highway
33 Department as is evident from the context wherein it is used.

For the purposes of Sections 27-103-101 through 34 (4) 27-103-139 and 27-104-1 through 27-104-27, the term "special 35 36 funds" shall mean all revenues and/or income other than appropriations from the State General Fund which are received, 37 collected by, or available for the support of or expenditure by 38 any state general-fund agency or special-fund agency or the State 39 40 Highway Department or the Division of State Aid Road Construction of the State Highway Department, whether such funds be derived 41 from taxes or fees collected by or for such general-fund agency or 42 special-fund agency or the State Highway Department or the 43 Division of State Aid Road Construction of the State Highway 44 45 Department, as the case may be, or from any other types of revenue from any other source. 46

(5) For the purposes of Sections 27-103-101 through 27-103-139 and 27-104-1 through 27-104-27, the term "special funds" shall include revolving funds and all funds received from the United States government by any state general-fund agency or special-fund agency, but shall not include any revolving fund established prior to July 1, 1984, for the purpose of paying or retiring any indebtedness as is authorized by statute.

54 (6) For the purposes of Sections 27-103-101 through
55 27-103-139 and 27-104-1 through 27-104-27, the term "special
56 funds" shall include any court-ordered settlement payments or
57 other payments received by any state general-fund agency or
58 special-fund agency as the result of litigation.

59 SECTION *. Section 27-104-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 60 amended as follows:

27-104-13. The State Fiscal Officer shall have the right to 61 disapprove or reduce and revise such estimates of general funds 62 and state-source special funds for any general fund or special 63 fund agency, and for the "administration and other expenses" 64 budget of the State Highway Department, in an amount not to exceed 65 five percent (5%) if he finds that funds will not be available 66 within the period for which the budget is drawn, or if he finds 67 that the requested expenditures, or any part thereof, are not 68 authorized by law, and such action shall be reported to the 69 Legislative Budget Office. The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his 70 71 determination of need based upon a finding that funds will not be available within the period for which the budget is drawn, 72 transfer funds as provided in Section 27-103-203, from the Working 73 Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement 74 75 the general fund revenue. In the event that the estimates of general funds and state-source special funds of all general fund 76 and special fund agencies, and of the "administration and other 77 78 expenses" budget of the State Highway Department, have been reduced by five percent (5%), additional reductions may be made 79 but shall consist of a uniform percentage reduction of general 80 funds and state-source special funds to all general fund and 81 special fund agencies, and to the "administration and other 82 expenses" budget of the State Highway Department. 83 Any state-source special funds reduced under the provisions of this 84 85 section shall be transferred to the State General Fund upon requisitions for warrants signed by the respective agency head and 86 said transfer shall be made within a reasonable period to be 87 determined by the State Fiscal Officer. 88

For the purpose of this section, "state-source special funds" shall be construed to mean any special funds in any agency derived from any source, <u>including any court-ordered settlement or other</u> <u>payments received by a state general-fund agency or special-fund</u> <u>agency as the result of litigation</u>, but shall not include the

following special funds: special funds derived from federal 94 95 sources, from local or regional political subdivisions, or from donations; special funds held in a fiduciary capacity for the 96 benefit of specific persons or classes of persons; self-generated 97 special funds of the state institutions of higher learning or the 98 state junior colleges; special funds of Mississippi Industries for 99 the Blind, the State Port at Gulfport, Yellow Creek Inland Port, 100 Pat Harrison Waterway District, Pearl River Basin Development 101 District, Pearl River Valley Water Management District, Tombigbee 102 River Valley Water Management District, Yellow Creek Watershed 103 104 Authority, or Coast Coliseum Commission; special funds of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks derived from the 105 106 issuance of hunting or fishing licenses; and special funds generated by agencies whose primary function includes the 107 establishment of standards and the issuance of licenses for the 108 practice of a profession within the State of Mississippi. 109

SECTION *. Section 31-17-123, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

31-17-123. The intent of the Legislature is to authorize 112 113 borrowing funds under the provisions of Sections 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 to offset any temporary cash flow deficiencies and 114 115 should not be construed to authorize the borrowing of any funds in an amount which cannot be repaid during the fiscal year in which 116 such funds are borrowed. The State Tax Commission and University 117 Research Center, utilizing all available revenue forecast data, 118 shall annually develop a general fund revenue estimate to be 119 120 adopted by the Legislative Budget Office as of the date of sine die adjournment. If, at the end of October, or at the end of any 121 month thereafter of any fiscal year, the revenues received for the 122 fiscal year shall fall below ninety-eight percent (98%) of the 123 Legislative Budget Office general fund revenue estimate at the 124 125 date of sine die adjournment, the State Fiscal Officer shall reduce allocations of general funds and state-source special funds 126 to general fund and special fund agencies and to the 127 128 "administration and other expenses" budget of the State Highway

Department in an amount necessary to keep expenditures within the 129 130 sum of actual general fund receipts including any transfers to the General Fund from the Working Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund for 131 132 the fiscal year. The State Fiscal Officer may, upon his determination of need based on the revenue shortfall, transfer 133 funds as provided in Section 27-103-203, from the Working 134 Cash-Stabilization Reserve Fund to the General Fund to supplement 135 the general fund revenue. State-source special funds in an amount 136 equal to any reduction made under the provisions of this section 137 shall be transferred to the State General Fund upon requisitions 138 139 for warrants signed by the respective agency head and such transfer shall be made within a reasonable period to be determined 140 by the State Fiscal Officer. No agency's allocation shall be 141 reduced in an amount to exceed five percent (5%); however, in the 142 event that the allocations of general funds and state-source 143 special funds to all general fund and special fund agencies and to 144 the "administration and other expenses" budget of the State 145 146 Highway Department have been reduced by five percent (5%), any additional reductions required to be made hereunder shall consist 147 of a uniform percentage reduction of general funds and 148 state-source special funds to all general fund and special fund 149 150 agencies, and to the "administration and other expenses" budget of the State Highway Department. Any receipt from loans authorized 151 by Sections 31-17-101 through 31-17-123 shall not be included as 152 153 revenue receipts. The State Fiscal Officer shall immediately send notice of any action taken under authority of this section to the 154 155 Legislative Budget Office.

For the purpose of this section, "state-source special funds" 156 shall be construed to mean any special funds in any agency derived 157 from any source, including any court-ordered settlement or other 158 payments received by a state general-fund agency or special-fund 159 160 agency as the result of litigation, but shall not include the following special funds: special funds derived from federal 161 sources, from local or regional political subdivisions, or from 162 163 donations; special funds held in a fiduciary capacity for the SS26\HB1200A.5J
