Adopted AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

House Bill NO. 1605

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

6 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-13-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

The State Department of Education is 8 37-13-131. (1) 9 designated as the state agency responsible for the administration and supervision of the Comprehensive School Health Education 10 Program as an educational curriculum in the State of Mississippi. 11 It is the intent of the Legislature that all funds made available 12 to the State Department of Education for the purpose of 13 14 comprehensive school health education shall be administered by the 15 State Department of Education.

Pursuant to the provisions of subsection (1) of this 16 (2)section, the State Department of Education is authorized to 17 establish an Office of Comprehensive School Health Education 18 within the framework of the State Department of Education for the 19 purpose of developing standards, procedures and criteria for the 20 administration and supervision of a statewide program of health 21 22 education in Kindergarten through Grade 12. The State Department of Education, through the Office of Comprehensive School Health 23 Education, shall assume the further responsibility for promoting a 24 statewide effort designed to prepare local school faculties and 25

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26 staffs to incorporate the comprehensive health education concept 27 into their local educational programs.

The Mississippi Department of Health, in conjunction 28 (3) with the Office of Student Development-Branch of Health-Related 29 Services of the State Department of Education, shall develop a 30 long-range strategic plan for a Comprehensive School Health 31 Education Program in Grades K through 12. The Comprehensive 32 School Health Education Program shall encompass four (4) 33 interdependent components: (a) health education; (b) health 34 service; (c) physical education and fitness; and (d) a healthful 35 school environment. These curriculum components shall be designed 36 to develop decision-making competencies related to health and 37 health behavior. Such curriculum components are intended to 38 motivate health maintenance and promote wellness, not only to 39 prevent disease or disability. The Mississippi Department of 40 Health, in conjunction with the Office of Student 41 42 Development-Branch of Health-Related Services of the Department of Education, shall develop the strategic plan and make a report 43 44 thereon to the Governor and the Legislature on or before January 1, 1995. 45 (4) The Legislature recognizes that there is a problem with 46

47 Mississippi student inactivity and obesity in the elementary

48 school years, and therefore recommends the following guidelines

49 for school district physical education and fitness classes:

50 Grades Kindergarten through Six: thirty (30) minutes per day;

51 Grades Seven through Nine: two (2) hours per week.

52 <u>Until such time that state-source funds can be appropriated,</u> 53 <u>it is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department</u>

54 <u>of Education make application for any federal funds available to</u>

55 <u>implement this recommendation.</u>

56 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 57 and after July 1, 2002.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
