If, at the end of any calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the 87 agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed 88 this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2003 "Personal 89 Services" appropriated level, when annualized in compliance with 90 91 the provisions of this act, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement 92 will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as 93 94 the requirements of this provision are met.

- 225 **SECTION 18.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 226 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

- 228 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 229 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 230 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
