With respect to agency programs whose operation 303 is dependent on the receipt of federal funds, it is the intent of 304 the Legislature, except as hereinafter provided, that no funds 305 from the State General Fund be expended to administer, support or SS05\HB1801A.J in any way continue such programs should federal funds for their operation be reduced or become unavailable and that no funds from the State General Fund available for expenditure under this act shall be used to replace federal funds in any major object of expenditure.

311 SECTION 18. 344 SECTION 20. Of the funds provided in Section 1, Five Hundred Twenty-one Thousand Five Hundred Seventeen Dollars (\$521,517.00) 345 shall be used to provide for a Director of School Nurses in the 346 State Department of Education and the implementation of three (3) 347 pilot projects for a variety of school health programs in an 348 elementary school setting. Evaluations shall be developed to 349 determine the program's effect to drop-out rates, suspensions, 350 351 expulsions, attendance and test scores.

Income generated by the school-based clinics shall remain available for expenditure by the programs utilizing any special fund authority provided in Section 2 for use by the State Department of Education and the pilots shall remain the same as in Fiscal Year 2002.

357 SECTION 21. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 358 State Department of Education shall have the authority to accept, 359 budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Thirty Million 360 Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), that become available to the department 361 to carry out the provisions of those funds in a manner consistent 362 with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and 363 Administration.

SECTION 22. The State Department of Education shall transfer 364 365 the designated amounts to the appropriate entities, which shall assume full responsibility for the expenditure of these funds in 366 367 accordance with state laws and accept all responsibility for any improper expenditure. For the following: National Guard Youth 368 Challenge Program, World Class Teacher Programs, USM Special 369 Education Program, Soil and Water Conservation Commission, 370 Mississippi School Boards Association, Mississippi Eye Screening 371 372 Program and Very Special Arts, Arts Institute, Jackson State University Media Center, Jobs for Mississippi Graduates, and 373 Mississippi Symphony, University of Southern Mississippi Safe 374 375 Schools Program, Mississippi State University Center for Education SS05\HB1801A.J

376 Design, Writing and Thinking Institute and Greater Columbus Early 377 Learning Center.

378 **SECTION 23.** Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 379 the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is 380 provided for the Walnut Grove Correctional Facility.

381 SECTION 24. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, the 382 amounts of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is 383 provided for the Writing and Thinking Institute and Seventy-five 384 Thousand (\$75,000.00) is provided for the Very Special Arts 385 Program.

386 SECTION 25. Of the funds appropriated herein, the State Department of Education shall expend an amount not to exceed Three 387 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) for the purpose of 388 providing technical assistance and training to local school 389 districts in the development of behavior modification plans and to 390 provide funding to defray the costs of psychological evaluations 391 392 performed upon a child in compliance with the Mississippi School 393 Safety Act of 2001. Local school districts shall be required to report to the State Department of Education all expulsions of 394 395 students as authorized under Section 6 of Senate Bill No. 2239, 2001 Regular Session. The State Department of Education shall 396 397 annually report to the Legislature by January of each year.

398 **SECTION 26.** Of the funds appropriated in Sections 9 and 10, 399 an amount not to exceed One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars 400 (\$1,300,000.00) shall be used for technological methods for 401 agricultural programs.

402 SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, an 403 amount not to exceed One Million Six Hundred Eighty-nine Thousand 404 Nine Hundred Fifty-eight Dollars (\$1,689,958.00) shall be 405 transferred from the State Department of Education to the 406 Mississippi National Guard for the support of the Youth Challenge 407 Program at Camp Shelby.

408 SECTION 28. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 409 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 410 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon SS05\HB1801A.J 411 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 412 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 413 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 414 SECTION 29. This act shall take effect and be in force from 415 and after July 1, 2002.
