## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 502

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH A STUDY COMMITTEE TO
 STUDY THE LONG-TERM EFFECTS OF THE NISSAN PLANT AND THE PROPOSED
 EXPANSION OF THE NISSAN PLANT AND ITS SERVICE AND SUPPLIERS ON THE
 PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM OF MADISON COUNTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN,
 That:

(1) There is established a committee to study the long-term 8 9 effects of the Nissan plant and the proposed expansion of the 10 Nissan plant and its service and suppliers on the public school system of Madison County and make recommendations to the 11 Legislature. The committee shall make a report of its findings 12 and recommendations to the Legislature before December 15, 2002. 13 The committee shall specifically examine the impact of (2)14 the new jobs at the Nissan plant and its service and supplier 15 components on the public school instructional staff, 16 administrative staff, school buildings, school bus transportation 17 and infrastructure in Madison County which will be necessary to 18 19 meet the needs of the additional population created by such new jobs. The committee shall also examine the results of the new 20 Mississippi Adequate Education Funding Formula and its effect on 21 the Madison County public schools as the population of this area 22 23 increases.

(3) The study committee shall be composed of the followingtwelve (12) members:

(a) Three (3) members of the House of Representatives
appointed by the Speaker of the House, two (2) of whom shall

28 represent Madison County;

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Three (3) members of the Senate appointed by the 29 (b) 30 Lieutenant Governor, two (2) of whom shall represent Madison 31 County; The Executive Director of the Central Mississippi 32 (C) 33 Planning and Development District, or his designee; The State Superintendent of Public Education, or 34 (d) his designee; 35 The County Superintendent of Education of Madison (e) 36 County; 37 (f) The Superintendent of the Canton Municipal Separate 38 39 School District; (q) The Executive Director of the Mississippi 40 41 Development Authority, or his designee; and The Executive Director of the Department of Finance 42 (h) and Administration, or his designee. 43 Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days after 44 (4)passage of this act. Within fifteen (15) days thereafter, on a 45 day to be designated jointly by the Speaker of the House and the 46 Lieutenant Governor, the study committee shall meet and organize 47 48 by selecting from its membership a chairman and vice chairman. The vice chairman shall serve as secretary and shall be 49 50 responsible for keeping all records of the study committee. Α majority of the members of the study committee shall constitute a 51 In the selection of its officers and the adoption of 52 quorum. 53 rules, resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority of the study committee present and voting is required. 54 The committee shall meet upon the call of the chairman, and all 55 members shall be notified in writing of all meetings, and such 56 57 notices must be mailed at least five (5) days before the date on which a meeting is to be held. 58

(5) Each legislative member of the committee shall be paid
from the contingent expense fund of his respective house per diem
in the amount authorized by Section 25-3-69, Mississippi Code of

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62 1972, and a mileage allowance and an expense allowance in the amount authorized by Section 5-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972. 63 However, no per diem, mileage allowance or expense allowance may 64 65 be paid for attending meetings of the committee while the 66 Legislature is in session, and no per diem, mileage allowance or expense allowance may be paid without prior approval of the proper 67 committee in the member's respective house. No study committee 68 member may incur per diem, travel or other expenses unless 69 previously authorized by vote, at a meeting of the study 70 committee, which action must be recorded in the official minutes 71 72 of the meeting.

(6) The study committee may employ consultants or staff and may utilize clerical and legal staff employed by any state agency, school district, political subdivision or municipality of the state, and any other staff assistance made available to the committee.

78 (7) Funding for the study committee may be provided from any 79 funds that may be appropriated by the Legislature for the expenses 80 of the study committee. The study committee may accept money from 81 any source, public or private, to be expended in implementing its 82 duties under this act.

(8) Upon presentation of its report to the Legislature
before the 2003 Regular Session, the study committee shall be
dissolved.
