THOMPSON FOR HIS 1 SERVICE TO THE CHILDREN OF MISSISSIPPI UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS 2 3 DEPARTURE AFTER MANY YEARS OF DEDICATED SERVICE AS STATE 4 SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION. Thompson announced 5 his resignation as State Superintendent of Education in 6 Mississippi after four years of outstanding leadership; and 7 WHEREAS, he is completing his second tenure of dedicated 8 9 service as Mississippi's State Superintendent of Education; and WHEREAS, a native of Warren County, North Carolina, he 10 received his Doctor of Education from the University of North 11 Carolina at Greensboro, his Master of Education from the 12 University of North Carolina at Charlotte, his Bachelor of Arts 13 from Elon College, and his Associate of Arts from Chowan College; 14 and 15 WHEREAS, he served as Deputy State Superintendent of Public 16 Schools for North Carolina and as the Director of the North 17 Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching; and 18 WHEREAS, he served as Superintendent of the Tupelo Public 19 20 School District from 1987-1990; and WHEREAS, he served on numerous boards and commissions, 21 including the Council of Chief State School Officers' Service 22 Advisory Committee, the Southeastern Regional Vision for 23 Education, the Governor's Commission on Workforce Excellence, the 24 Mississippi Economic Council, and Mississippi Authority for 25 26 Educational Television; and

38 WHEREAS, his instrumental leadership has resulted in a strong 39 assessment and accountability model, which was ranked sixth in the 40 nation by *The Princeton Review* as one of the most comprehensive 41 and consistent accountability systems; and

42 WHEREAS, his uncompromising commitment to the children of 43 Mississippi has resulted in significant advancements in public 44 education; and

WHEREAS, he is married to the former Peggy Hopkins and is 45 46 father to Tara Elizabeth Thompson and Whitney Dianne Thompson; and WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the service 47 48 of this state education leader who has brought honor to public education, his profession and to the State of Mississippi: 49 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 50 51 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend Dr. Richard L. Thompson, State Superintendent of Education, for his many years of service 52 53 to the State of Mississippi, on the occasion of his departure, and 54 extend to him and his family the best wishes of the Senate in his future endeavors. 55
