6	his resignation as State Superintendent of Education in
7	Mississippi after four years of outstanding leadership; and
8	WHEREAS, he is completing his second tenure of dedicated
9	service as Mississippi's State Superintendent of Education; and
10	WHEREAS, a native of Warren County, North Carolina, he
11	received his Doctor of Education from the University of North
12	Carolina at Greensboro, his Master of Education from the
13	University of North Carolina at Charlotte, his Bachelor of Arts
14	from Elon College, and his Associate of Arts from Chowan College;

16	WHEREAS, he served as Deputy State Superintendent of Public
17	Schools for North Carolina and as the Director of the North
18	Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching; and
19	WHEREAS, he served as Superintendent of the Tupelo Public
20	School District from 1987-1990; and
21	WHEREAS, he served on numerous boards and commissions,
22	including the Council of Chief State School Officers' Service
23	Advisory Committee, the Southeastern Regional Vision for
24	Education, the Governor's Commission on Workforce Excellence, the

Educational Television; and
