- 4 FOR THE FEDERAL CENTER FOR DISEASE CONTROL.
- 5 WHEREAS, long-time Executive Director of the State Department
- of Health, Dr. F.E. (Ed) Thompson, Jr., M.D., M.P.H., has been 6
- selected as the Deputy Director for Public Health Programs and 7
- Services, of the federal Center for Disease Control (CDC) and 8
- 9 ATSDR; and
- WHEREAS, F.E. Thompson, Jr., M.D., has been the State Health 10
- Officer of Mississippi since 1993. He holds an M.D. degree from 11
- the University of Mississippi School of Medicine and an M.P.H. 12
- degree from the Johns Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health. 13
- He is board certified in Preventive Medicine, and is a Clinical 14
- Associate Professor of Preventive Medicine at the University of 15
- 16 Mississippi School of Medicine; and
- WHEREAS, in 1980, Dr. Thompson began his career in public 17
- health in the Mississippi State Department of Health, first as a 18
- Physician and then as Deputy Chief for Disease Control from 19
- 1982-1985. From 1983-1993, Dr. Thompson was the State 20
- Epidemiologist, and from 1985-1993, he was the Chief of the Bureau 21
- of Preventive Health Services for the Mississippi State Department 22
- 23 of Health; and
- WHEREAS, prior to becoming Mississippi's State Health 24
- Officer, he served as Mississippi's State Epidemiologist for ten 25
- 26 years. He is a past President of the Council of State and
- Territorial Epidemiologists (CSTE), and the Association of State 27
- and Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO). He currently serves on 28

- 29 ASTHO's Infectious Disease Policy Committee and the ASTHO
- 30 Anti-Terrorism Preparedness Task Force; and
- 31 WHEREAS, from 1988-1993, Dr. Thompson was a member of the
- 32 Executive Committee for the Council of State and Territorial
- 33 Epidemiologists (CSTE), and he was President of CSTE from
- 34 1992-1993. From 1998-2001, he was a member of the Executive
- 35 Committee for the Association of State and Territorial Health
- 36 Officials (ASTHO), and he was President of ASTHO from 1998-1999.
- 37 In addition, Dr. Thompson is currently a member of CDC's Advisory
- 38 Committee to the Director and serves on several ASTHO committees,
- 39 including the Infectious Disease Policy Committee and the
- 40 Anti-Terrorism Preparedness Task Force; and
- 41 WHEREAS, Dr. Thompson has co-authored 11 publications in
- 42 nationally recognized journals, on topics such as immunization
- 43 requirements, influenza, HIV/AIDS and tobacco. Dr. Thompson also
- 44 provided testimony to Congress on numerous occasions representing
- 45 the American Public Health Association, the Mississippi Department
- 46 of Health, ASTHO and various other organizations; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Thompson has presented excellent and progressive
- 48 recommendations for public health program initiatives and funding
- 49 to the Legislature, has been a respected spokesman for public
- 50 health in the Legislature, and his expertise will be missed; and
- 51 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the long
- 52 public health service of this health professional who has brought
- 53 honor to the State of Mississippi:
