SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 23

- A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING DR. WALLACE 1 2.
- CONERLY, VICE CHANCELLOR AND DEAN OF THE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AT THE
- UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI MEDICAL CENTER, UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS 3
- RETIREMENT AFTER MANY YEARS OF DEDICATED PUBLIC SERVICE. 4
- 5 WHEREAS, Dr. A. Wallace (Wally) Conerly, M.D., has announced
- he will retire from his position as Vice Chancellor for Health 6
- Affairs and Dean of the School of Medicine at the University of 7
- 8 Mississippi Medical Center in Jackson, Mississippi, effective June
- 30, 2003; and 9
- WHEREAS, a member of the Medical Center faculty since 1973, 10
- Dr. Conerly served for 13 years as Assistant Vice Chancellor for 11
- 12 Health Affairs before he assumed his current appointment on August
- 13 2, 1994. A professor of medicine, he served as Medical Director
- at the Department of Respiratory Therapy at the University 14
- Hospital for 21 years and as Director of the Medical Center 15
- Division of Continuing Health Professional Education from 1979 to 16
- 1993. His medical practice is in the field of chest medicine and 17
- 18 critical care; and
- WHEREAS, as the chief executive officer of the state's only 19
- academic health science center, he leads an institution with an 20
- 21 annual budget of more than \$609,000,000 and a yearly payroll for
- its 7200 employees of \$303,870,606. He is the chief architect of 22
- 23 the Medical Center's ongoing expansion program, the largest in the
- history of state higher education. Phase I, completed in 1999 and 24
- totaling \$211,000,000 included a new children's hospital, a new 25
- 26 women and infant's hospital, a building for the School of Health
- Related Professions, an addition to the School of Nursing, a 27

- 28 student union, two parking garages and an imaging center. A
- 29 second \$124,000,000 construction phase is now underway. It
- 30 includes a critical care hospital already operational, a new
- 31 256-bed adult hospital, a classroom addition, a children's
- 32 hospital addition and an expansion to the Arthur C. Guyton
- 33 Research Complex; and
- 34 WHEREAS, a native of Tylertown, Dr. Conerly received his BS
- 35 degree with honors in 1957 at Millsaps College and his MD degree
- 36 in 1960 at Tulane University. He did special training at the US
- 37 Air Force School of Aerospace Medicine at Brooks Air Force Base,
- 38 Texas, did a fellowship in medicine in the Section of Cardiology
- 39 at Ochsner Foundation Hospital in New Orleans and took a residency
- 40 in internal medicine at the University of Mississippi Medical
- 41 Center. He was the institution's Mississippi Lung Association
- 42 Fellow in Pulmonary Disease from 1972-1974; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Conerly served in the US Air Force for more than
- 44 six years as Director of the Aerospace Medicine Division for the
- 45 3350th USAF Hospital at Moody AFB, GA, and Director of Base
- 46 Medical Services at Vance AFB, OK. Recipient of the USAF Flight
- 47 Surgeon of the Year Award in 1962, the USAF Commendation Medal in
- 48 1963, he was honorably discharged from the Air Force in 1966 at
- 49 the rank of major; and
- 50 WHEREAS, Dr. Conerly is a Fellow of the American College of
- 51 Chest Physicians. His past and present professional memberships
- 52 also include the American Medical Association, Mississippi State
- 53 Medical Association, Central Medical Society of Mississippi,
- 54 American Academy of General Practice, Aerospace Medical
- 55 Association, American and Mississippi Thoracic Societies, American
- 56 Society of Internal Medicine, Association of American Medical
- 57 Colleges and the Mississippi Academy of Sciences. Dr. Conerly
- 58 served a three-year term as the American College of Chest
- 59 Physicians' Commissioner on the Commission on Accreditation of
- 60 Allied Health Education Programs. He is a former examiner and

- 61 member of the Board of Trustees for the National Board for
- 62 Respiratory Care and has served on the Mississippi State Medical
- 63 Association Council on Medical Education, the Professional
- 64 Education Committee of the American Heart Association, Mississippi
- 65 Affiliate, and the Journal of Respiratory Diseases editorial
- 66 review board. He is also the state health contact for the
- 67 Southern Regional Educational Board; and
- 68 WHEREAS, Dr. Conerly has served on the Board of Directors of
- 69 the American Red Cross, Mississippi Chapter and the Capital Area
- 70 United Way. He is past President of the Rotary Club of Jackson
- 71 and past Chairman of the Board of Governors of the University
- 72 Club. He is on the boards of the Metro Jackson Chamber of
- 73 Commerce, Junior Achievement, the Jackson Medical Education
- 74 District, the Community Bank and is a member of the Community
- 75 Advisory Council of the Junior League of Jackson. The Mississippi
- 76 Division of the Multiple Sclerosis Society honored Dr. Conerly and
- 77 the Medical Center with its 2001 Hope Award. The award is given
- 78 annually for outstanding community contributions. He received
- 79 Millsaps College's "Alumnus of the Year" Award in 2002, and he and
- 80 his wife were recognized as the 2002 People of Vision by Preserve
- 81 Sight Mississippi; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. and Mrs. Conerly, the former Frances Bryan (BS
- 83 Millsaps 1958), are the parents of two sons, Al and Charlie; and
- WHEREAS, we are grateful for Dr. Conerly's legacy of service
- 85 in his profession and in Mississippi state government:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 87 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend and congratulate Dr.
- 88 Wallace Conerly, Vice Chancellor and Dean of the School of
- 89 Medicine at the University of Mississippi Medical Center, upon the
- 90 occasion of his retirement after many years of dedicated public
- 91 service, and with he and his wife, Frances, the best as he returns
- 92 to private life.
