HOUSE BILL NO. 11

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1-1-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 PROVIDE THAT THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF EACH PUBLIC 2 3 SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL BE PROVIDED A SET OF THE MISSISSIPPI CODE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 1-1-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 1-1-11. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this 8 9 section, the Joint Committee on Compilation, Revision and Publication of Legislation shall distribute or provide for the 10 distribution of the sets of the compilation of the Mississippi 11 Code of 1972 purchased by the state as follows: 12

Fifty-seven (57) sets to the Mississippi House of 13 Representatives and forty (40) sets to the Mississippi Senate for 14 the use of the Legislative Reference Bureau, Legislative Services 15 Offices, staffs and committees thereof. 16

Ten (10) sets to the Governor's Office; nine (9) sets to the 17 Secretary of State; and twenty (20) sets to the Auditor's Office. 18 One (1) set to each of the following: the Lieutenant 19 Governor; each member of the Legislature; the Treasurer; each 20 district attorney; each county attorney; each judge of the Court 21 of Appeals and each judge of the Supreme, circuit, chancery, 22 county, family, justice and municipal courts; each Mississippi 23 Senator and Mississippi Representative in Congress; State 24 Superintendent of Education; the office of the superintendent of 25 26 each public school district; Director of the Department of Finance and Administration; six (6) sets to the Performance Evaluation and 27 28 Expenditure Review (PEER) Committee, two (2) sets to the Director H. B. No. 11

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of the Legislative Budget Office; the Commissioner of Agriculture 29 30 and Commerce; each Mississippi Transportation Commissioner; six (6) sets to the Department of Corrections; the Insurance 31 Commissioner; the Clerk of the Supreme Court; the State Board of 32 33 Health; each circuit clerk; each chancery clerk in the state for 34 the use of the chancery clerk and the board of supervisors; each sheriff in the state for the use of his office and the county 35 officers; and each county for the county library (and an 36 additional set shall be given to each circuit clerk, chancery 37 clerk, sheriff and county library in counties having two (2) 38 judicial districts). 39

Two (2) sets to the Department of Archives and History; two 40 (2) sets to the State Soil and Water Conservation Commission; 41 sixty-eight (68) sets to the Attorney General's Office; six (6) 42 sets to the Public Service Commission; four (4) sets to the Public 43 Utilities Staff; thirty-six (36) sets to the State Tax Commission; 44 two (2) sets to the State Personnel Board; six (6) sets to the 45 State Law Library; one (1) set to the Library of Congress; ten 46 (10) sets to the University of Mississippi Law School; one (1) set 47 48 each to the Mississippi School for the Deaf and the Mississippi School for the Blind; one (1) set each to the University of 49 50 Mississippi, Mississippi State University, Mississippi University for Women, University of Southern Mississippi, Delta State 51 University, Alcorn State University, Jackson State University, 52 Mississippi Valley State University, and the Board of Trustees of 53 State Institutions of Higher Learning; and one (1) set to the 54 55 Supreme Court judges' conference room. In furtherance of the State Library's reciprocal program of code exchange with libraries 56 of the several states, the joint committee shall, at the direction 57 and only upon the written request of the State Librarian, 58 59 distribute or provide for the distribution of sets of the code to 60 such libraries.

No. 11 03/HR03/R447 PAGE 2 (GT\LH) One (1) set to each state junior or community college; three 61 (3) sets to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks; two 62 (2) sets to the Department of Environmental Quality; two (2) sets 63 to the Department of Marine Resources; two (2) sets to the 64 65 Mississippi Ethics Commission; six (6) sets to the Mississippi 66 Workers' Compensation Commission; four (4) sets to the State Department of Rehabilitation Services; and seven (7) sets to the 67 Department of Human Services. One (1) set to each of the 68 following: State Textbook Procurement Commission; University 69 Medical Center; State Library Commission; Department of 70 71 Agriculture and Commerce; Forestry Commission; and seventeen (17) sets to the Department of Public Safety. Also, one (1) set to 72 73 each of the following: Adjutant General, Mississippi Development Authority, Department of Banking and Consumer Finance, Bureau of 74 75 Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, the State 76 Educational Finance Commission, the Mississippi Board of Vocational and Technical Education, Division of Medicaid, State 77 78 Board of Mental Health, and Department of Youth Services.

The joint committee is authorized to distribute or provide for the distribution of additional sets of the Mississippi Code, not to exceed three (3) sets, to the office of each district attorney for the use of his assistants.

The joint committee shall provide to the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate the annual supplements to the Mississippi Code of 1972 for each set of the code maintained by the House and Senate.

The set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 to be provided to each member of the Legislature shall be provided unless specifically waived by such legislator in writing.

An elected or appointed officeholder in the State of Mississippi, except for a member of the Legislature, shall deliver to his successor in office, or to the joint committee if there is

Before the joint committee delivers or provides for delivery 95 of a copy of the Mississippi Code of 1972 to an individual 96 97 officeholder, the joint committee shall prepare and submit a 98 written agreement to the officeholder. The agreement shall, among other provisions, state that the code is the property of the State 99 of Mississippi, that it shall be transferred to the officeholder's 100 successor in office, that the officeholder has an obligation to 101 make such transfer and that the officeholder shall be responsible 102 103 for the failure to deliver the code and for any damage or destruction to the code, normal wear and tear excepted. The joint 104 105 committee shall execute the agreement and forward it to the officeholder for execution. The joint committee shall not deliver 106 or provide for delivery of the code to the officeholder until the 107 executed agreement is received by the committee. The joint 108 109 committee may include in the agreement such other provisions as it 110 may deem reasonable and necessary. In addition to damages or any other remedy for not transferring a set of the code to his 111 112 successor, an officeholder who does not transfer his set of the code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction, 113 114 pay a fine of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Upon request of the joint committee, the Attorney General shall assist the joint 115 committee in taking such actions as necessary to require an 116 117 officeholder to transfer the set of code provided under this section to his successor, or to the joint committee if there is no 118 119 successor, and to recover reimbursement or damages from any officeholder for the loss of or damage or destruction to any 120 volumes of the set of the code provided under this section, other 121 than normal wear and tear. 122

123 Replacement of missing, damaged or destroyed sets or volumes 124 of the code provided by this chapter may be obtained from the code

127 No more than one (1) set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 128 shall be furnished to any one (1) individual, regardless of the 129 office or offices he may hold.

130 (2) The joint committee, in its discretion, may determine 131 whether electronic access to the Mississippi Code of 1972 is 132 available and a sufficient substitute for actual bound volumes of 133 the code and, if so, may omit furnishing any one or more sets 134 otherwise required by this section.

135 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 136 and after July 1, 2003.
