HOUSE BILL NO. 168

1	AN ACT TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A
2	STUDY ON THE PRESCRIBED USE OF PSYCHIATRIC DRUGS BY SCHOOL-AGE
3	CHILDREN IN THIS STATE AND THE EFFECTS OF PSYCHIATRIC DRUGS ON
4	THOSE CHILDREN, AND TO PRESENT A REPORT OF ITS STUDY TO THE
5	LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** (1) The Legislature finds that:
- 8 (a) During the past decade the number of American
- 9 children receiving psychiatric drugs for behavioral and emotional
- 10 disorders has increased dramatically; and
- 11 (b) National medical reports indicate that psychiatric
- 12 drugs are prescribed to between five and six million children each
- 13 year, who represent about ten percent (10%) of the total
- 14 school-age population; and
- 15 (c) The International Narcotics Control Board of the
- 16 World Health Organization has reported that the United States is
- 17 among the leading users of psychiatric drugs and has warned us
- 18 against our national trend to overprescribe stimulants for
- 19 children; and
- 20 (d) Opponents of the use of psychiatric drugs express
- 21 concern that there is not enough information about the drugs'
- 22 effect on children's development or on their long-term side
- 23 effects, while proponents say that children sometimes need
- 24 medication to combat mental illnesses.
- 25 (2) The State Department of Health shall conduct a study on
- 26 the prescribed use of psychiatric drugs by school-age children in
- 27 this state and the effects of psychiatric drugs on those children,
- 28 and shall provide recommendations for improved oversight of the

- 29 prescribed use of psychiatric drugs among those children. The
- 30 department shall present a report of its study, together with any
- 31 recommended legislation, to the Legislature not later than
- 32 December 15, 2003.
- 33 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 34 and after July 1, 2003.
