HOUSE BILL NO. 229

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 27-19-81 AND 27-19-89, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE FEES COLLECTED BY THE 3 MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF HARVEST PERMITS TO OPERATORS OF VEHICLES HAULING CERTAIN PRODUCTS, AND THE FINES AND PENALTIES COLLECTED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE VEHICLE WEIGHT 6 7 LIMITS AUTHORIZED ON STATE HIGHWAYS, SHALL BE DEPOSITED INTO A SPECIAL FUND CREATED IN THE STATE TREASURY; TO PROVIDE THAT MONIES 8 IN THE SPECIAL FUND SHALL BE ALLOCATED AND DISTRIBUTED TO EACH OF 9 THE COUNTIES IN THE STATE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE AID ROAD 10 FORMULA AND MAY BE EXPENDED BY THE COUNTIES FOR COUNTY ROAD AND 11 BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 27-19-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 14 amended as follows: 15 27-19-81. (1) No vehicle shall be registered by the State 16 Tax Commission or by a tax collector, and no license tag 17 whatsoever shall be issued therefor, where the gross weight of 18 such vehicle exceeds the limits provided by law. In the event of 19 an emergency requiring the hauling of a greater gross weight than 20 permitted by law, the owner or operator of such vehicle shall 21 obtain an excess weight authorization from the Mississippi 22 Department of Transportation or local authority having 23 jurisdiction of the particular road, street or highway before 24 operating such vehicle on the highways of this state to haul such 25 a gross weight over a route to be designated by the aforesaid 26 department. It shall then be necessary for the owner or operator 27 of the vehicle to obtain a permit from the Transportation 28 Department, which shall be issued by the department under the same 29 30 provisions as are provided for the issuance of trip permits under Section 27-19-79, but which permit shall likewise be obtained 31

prior to the operation of such vehicle on the highways.

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- 33 persons or agencies other than the Mississippi Department of
- 34 Transportation shall have authority to issue the permits provided
- 35 for in this section. The fee to be charged for such permits shall
- 36 be computed in the same manner provided in Section 27-19-79 for
- 37 each one thousand (1,000) pounds, or fractional part thereof, of
- 38 gross weight above the licensed capacity of the vehicle, up to the
- 39 maximum legal weights provided by this article on the roads to be
- 40 traveled.
- This subsection shall apply, but not be limited to, any
- 42 tractor, road roller or road machinery used solely and
- 43 specifically in road building or other highway construction or
- 44 maintenance work.
- For each one thousand (1,000) pounds, or fractional part
- 46 thereof, in excess of the weight authorized by Sections 63-5-29
- 47 and 63-5-33 for any such vehicle or in excess of the limits set by
- 48 the Transportation Department for specified roads and bridges, the
- 49 fee shall be Five Cents (5¢) per one thousand (1,000) pounds, or
- 50 fractional part thereof, for each mile traveled upon the highways
- of the state, except that the fee for manufactured housing modular
- 52 units, residential or commercial, shall be Two Cents (2¢) per one
- 53 thousand (1,000) pounds, or fractional part thereof, for each mile
- 54 traveled upon the highways of the state. Provided, however, no
- 55 permit shall be issued for a fee of less than Ten Dollars
- 56 (\$10.00).
- 57 The Transportation Department may provide for an annual
- 58 permit which will allow pre-approved vehicles and loads to travel
- 59 predesignated routes with self-issued permits. Under such
- 60 self-issuance authority, the owner of the vehicle shall complete
- 61 the permit in a format designated by the department,
- 62 electronically transmit a copy to the department prior to the
- 63 move, and ensure that a copy is in the possession of the operator.
- 64 Vehicles having a gross weight exceeding the limits provided by
- 65 law that have a nondivisible gross vehicle weight of ninety-five

thousand (95,000) pounds or less, which are otherwise legal, shall 66 67 not be restricted as to the hours of the day such vehicles may be 68 operated on predesignated routes. The department shall bill the 69 vehicle owner according to the provisions of the preceding 70 paragraph. The department is authorized to modify predesignated 71 routes at any time for cause, such as highway construction or hazardous highway conditions. The annual fee for the 72 self-issuance permit authority obtained pursuant to this paragraph 73 shall be Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) per owner, regardless of 74 the number of vehicles which he will operate pursuant to such 75 76 permit, in addition to any other fees required by this section. 77 Any vehicle and load being operated pursuant to this paragraph for 78 which the operator does not have the permit or a copy thereof in his possession, or for which a copy of the permit was not 79 electronically transmitted to the department, shall be deemed not 80 to have a permit and shall be penalized accordingly. 81 Before operating a vehicle where the size of the load 82 (2) being hauled is in excess of that permitted by law, the owner or 83 operator of such vehicle shall obtain excess size authorization 84 85 from the Transportation Department or proper local authority and an excess size permit from the Transportation Department. Such 86

87 excess size permit shall be issued by the Mississippi Department of Transportation under the same provisions as are provided for 88 the issuance of trip permits under Section 27-19-79, and it shall 89 90 be obtained prior to the operation of such vehicle on the highways. The fee to be charged for such excess size permit shall 91 92 be Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per trip. Such permits may be issued for an extended period of time and must coincide with the expiration 93 date and other provisions of the carrier's permit or authorization 94 issued by the Transportation Department or local authority. 95 fee for such extended permits shall be based upon an annual fee of 96 97 One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per carrier. No permit shall be issued under this subsection if the issuance of the permit would 98

- violate federal law or would cause the State of Mississippi to
 lose federal aid funds. This subsection shall not apply to any
 tractor, road roller or road machinery used solely and
 specifically in road building or other highway construction or
 maintenance work or to any machinery or equipment operated on the
 highways or transported thereon in the course of normal farming
 activities, including cotton module transporters.
- 106 (3) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of
 107 Transportation may authorize certain carriers of property to issue
 108 overweight and/or oversize permits for vehicles owned or operated
 109 by such carriers, provided such carriers have blanket
 110 authorization from the Transportation Commission and also meet
 111 other requirements established by the Transportation Commission.
- 111 The owner or operator of a vehicle hauling sand, gravel, 112 wood chips, wood shavings, sawdust, fill dirt, agricultural 113 products or unprocessed forestry products may apply to the 114 Mississippi Department of Transportation for a harvest permit for 115 116 the purpose of authorizing any such vehicles to operate on the highways in this state (other than the federal interstate system 117 118 or those highways designated by the Mississippi Department of Transportation as not capable of carrying more than fifty-seven 119 thousand six hundred fifty (57,650) pounds at the maximum gross 120 weight specified in Section 63-5-33). Harvest permits may be 121 issued and are valid to permit any such vehicle to be operated on 122 123 a highway in this state that has been designated by the Mississippi Department of Transportation as not capable of 124 125 carrying more than fifty-seven thousand six hundred fifty (57,650) pounds only if such vehicle operates in compliance with the 126 provisions of Section 63-5-29(3)(b). A fee of Twenty-five Dollars 127 128 (\$25.00) shall be charged for each permit issued. The permit shall be in the form of a decal which shall be affixed to each 129 130 permitted vehicle on the upper left corner of the windshield on the driver's side. Each permit shall expire one (1) year from its 131

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- 132 date of issue. The fees collected under this subsection shall be
- 133 deposited into the special fund that is created under Section 3 of
- 134 House Bill No. ____, 2003 Regular Session. This subsection (4)
- 135 shall stand repealed from and after July 1, 2005.
- 136 (5) Any owner or operator who has met the requirements set
- 137 by the Mississippi Transportation Commission may defer payment of
- 138 permits issued by the department until the end of the current
- 139 month. If full payment is not received by the twentieth of the
- 140 following month, there may be added as damages to the total amount
- 141 of the delinquency or deficiency the following percentages: ten
- 142 percent (10%) for the first offense; fifteen percent (15%) for the
- 143 second offense and twenty-five percent (25%) for the third and any
- 144 subsequent offense. Upon the third offense, the department may
- 145 suspend the privilege to defer payment. The balance due shall
- 146 become payable upon notice and demand by the department.
- 147 (6) The permit fee monies collected under this section,
- 148 except as provided for in subsection (4) of this section, shall be
- 149 deposited into the State Highway Fund for the construction,
- 150 maintenance and reconstruction of highways and roads of the State
- 151 of Mississippi or the payment of interest and principal on bonds
- 152 authorized by the Legislature for construction and reconstruction
- 153 of highways.
- 154 (7) The department may waive the permits, taxes and fees set
- 155 forth in this section whenever a motor vehicle is operated upon
- 156 the public highways in this state in response to an emergency, a
- 157 major disaster or the threat of a major disaster.
- SECTION 2. Section 27-19-89, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 159 amended as follows:
- 160 27-19-89. (a) If any nonresident owner or operator or other
- 161 nonresident person eligible for a temporary permit as provided in
- 162 Section 27-19-79, who has not elected to register and pay the
- 163 annual privilege taxes prescribed, shall enter or go upon the
- 164 public highways of the state and shall fail or refuse to obtain

the permit required by Section 27-19-79, such person shall be 165 liable, for the first such offense, for the full amount of the 166 permit fee required, plus a penalty thereon of five hundred 167 168 percent (500%). For the second and all subsequent offenses, such 169 person who fails or refuses to obtain such permits shall be liable 170 for the pro rata part of the annual tax for the balance of the tag year for the maximum legal gross weight of the vehicle plus a 171 penalty thereon of twenty-five percent (25%). Any weight in 172 excess of the maximum legal gross weight of the vehicle, or in 173 excess of the maximum highway weight limit, shall be penalized 174 175 according to subsection (c) of this section. In either case the excess weight shall be removed by the operator before the vehicle 176 can be allowed to proceed. In order to constitute a "second or 177 subsequent offense" under the provisions hereof, it shall not be 178 179 necessary that the same or identical vehicle be involved, it being 180 the declared purpose hereof to provide that such penalties shall 181 run against the owner or operator rather than against the 182 specified vehicle. It is further provided that, in order for such owner or operator to become liable for the penalties herein 183 184 provided, it shall not be necessary to show that such owner or operator was guilty of willfulness, gross negligence or 185 186 wantonness, but the offense shall be complete upon the failure or refusal to obtain the required permit. 187

If any person who has registered his vehicle in 188 189 Mississippi shall operate such vehicle upon the public highways, having a gross weight greater than the licensed gross weight of 190 such vehicle, and shall fail or refuse to obtain a permit therefor 191 as required by Section 27-19-79, or if any person shall operate 192 any such registered vehicle upon the public highways in a higher 193 194 classification than that for which it is registered, and shall fail or refuse to obtain a permit therefor as required by Section 195 196 27-19-79, then such person shall be liable for the pro rata part 197 of the annual tax for the balance of the tag year for the legal H. gross weight of such vehicle and in the classification in which 198 same is being operated, plus a penalty thereon of twenty-five 199 percent (25%), after having been given credit for the unexpired 200 201 part of the privilege tax paid, as provided in Section 27-19-75. 202 In order that such owner or operator shall become liable for the penalties herein provided, it shall not be necessary to show that 203 204 such owner or operator was guilty of willfulness, gross negligence or wantonness, but the offense shall be complete upon the failure 205 or refusal to obtain the required permit. 206

If any person shall operate upon a highway of this state 207 208 a vehicle which has a greater vehicle gross weight than the maximum gross weight limit established by law for that highway and 209 shall have failed to obtain an overload permit as required by 210 Section 27-19-81, or if any person shall operate a vehicle with a 211 greater load on any axle or axle grouping than allowed by law, 212 then such person, owner or operator shall be assessed a penalty on 213 such axle load weight or vehicle gross weight as exceeds the legal 214 215 limit in accordance with the following schedule:

Any vehicle in violation of the tolerance allowed pursuant to 231 Section 63-5-33(3) shall be fined pursuant to Section 27-19-89(c) 232 for all weight in excess of the legal highway gross weight limit 233 234 authorized for such vehicle or for all weight in excess of the 235 legal tandem axle load weight limit of forty thousand (40,000) 236 pounds and the legal single axle load limit of twenty thousand (20,000) pounds, whichever the case may be. 237 The penalty to be assessed for operations of a vehicle with a 238 greater load on any axle or axle grouping than the legal axle load 239 weight limits shall be one-half (1/2) the penalty for operation in 240 241 excess of the legal gross weight limit. In instances where both the legal highway gross weight limit 242 and the legal axle load weight limit(s) are exceeded, the fine 243 that shall be levied shall be either the penalty amount for the 244 excess vehicle gross weight or the total of the penalty amounts of 245 all overloaded axles, whichever is the larger amount. 246 Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section to the 247 248 contrary, the fine assessed against the holder of a harvest permit for exceeding a gross vehicle weight of eighty-four thousand 249 250 (84,000) pounds shall be Five Cents (5¢) per pound and Fifteen Cents (15¢) per pound for exceeding a gross vehicle weight of one 251 252 hundred thousand (100,000) pounds. 253 the contrary, upon an appeal to the Appeals Board of the 254 255

Notwithstanding any other provision of this subsection (c) to Mississippi Transportation Commission by an owner or operator of a vehicle hauling without a harvest permit any of the products or 256 materials described in subsection (3) of Section 63-5-33 and upon 257 whom a penalty has been assessed under this subsection (c) for 258 exceeding the legal weight limit(s) on a highway having a legal 259 260 weight limit of eighty thousand (80,000) pounds or less, the appeals board shall reduce the penalty assessed against such 261 262 owner/operator to an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the 263 amount which would otherwise be due without the reduction

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authorized under this paragraph. A reduction shall not be 264 authorized under this paragraph if the gross weight of the vehicle 265 for which an owner/operator has been charged with a violation of 266 267 this section exceeds eighty-four thousand (84,000) pounds; and, in 268 any event, no reduction shall be authorized under this paragraph unless a penalty assessed under this section is appealed to the 269 270 appeals board and unless the board determines, based upon its records, that such owner/operator has not been granted a penalty 271 reduction under this paragraph within a period of twelve (12) 272 months immediately preceding the date of filing an appeal with the 273 274 board for a penalty reduction under this paragraph.

- If any nonresident owner or operator who has not registered his vehicle and paid the annual privilege taxes prescribed shall operate his vehicle upon the highways of this state when such vehicle has a greater gross weight than permitted by law for the highway traveled upon, and for which such excess gross weight a permit was not or could not be procured from the transportation department as required by Section 27-19-81, such person shall be liable upon his second and all subsequent offenses for the pro rata part of the annual tax for the balance of the tag year for the legal gross weight of the vehicle, and in addition thereto the penalty fee on the excess weight as specified in subsection (c) of this section. In order that such owner or operator shall become liable for the penalties herein provided, it shall not be necessary that the same or identical vehicle be involved, it being the declared purpose hereof to provide that such penalties shall run against the owner or operator rather than against the specific vehicle.
- (e) All fines and penalties imposed and collected by the
 Mississippi Department of Transportation for violations of the
 maximum legal vehicle weight limits authorized on the highways of
 this state shall be deposited into the special fund that is

SECTION 3. (1) There is created in the State Treasury a 298 299 special fund to be designated as the "2003 Feeder Road Improvement 300 Fund." The fund shall consist of the monies required to be deposited therein under Sections 27-19-81(4) and 27-19-89(e) and 301 302 such other monies as the Legislature appropriates or otherwise 303 designates for deposit into the fund. Monies in the fund shall be allocated and distributed to each of the counties in the state 304 upon requisition of the State Aid Engineer on October 1 of each 305 306 year in accordance with the state aid road formula as prescribed 307 in Section 65-9-3. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General 308 309 Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund. 310
