HOUSE BILL NO. 383

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-43-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS SHALL BE REQUIRED TO PRESENT ALL NEW REGULATIONS OR RULES OR CHANGES TO RULES OR REGULATIONS TO CERTAIN LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEES; TO AMEND SECTION 49-4-4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-43-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 25-43-7. (1) Prior to the adoption, amendment or repeal of
- 11 any rule, the agency shall give at least thirty (30) days' notice
- 12 of its intended action. The notice shall include a statement of
- 13 either the terms or substance of the intended action or a
- 14 description of the subjects and issues involved, and the manner in
- 15 which interested persons may present their views thereon. The
- 16 notice shall be filed with the Office of the Secretary of State
- 17 and mailed by the agency to all persons who have made timely
- 18 request of the agency for advance notice of its rule-making
- 19 proceedings. The Secretary of State shall furnish copies at the
- 20 request of any person and shall be reimbursed by the requesting
- 21 person for the expense of providing such service.
- 22 (2) In accordance with the provisions of this chapter and in
- 23 addition to the provisions of subsection (1) of this section,
- before the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may adopt,
- 25 amend or repeal any of its rules or regulations, the commission
- 26 shall present all of the proposed new rules or regulations or the
- 27 proposed repeal or amendment of any rules or regulations to both
- 28 the Game and Fish Committee of the Mississippi House of
- 29 Representatives and the Wildlife and Fisheries Committee of the

- 30 Mississippi Senate no later than thirty (30) days after the first
- 31 day of the next regular session of the Mississippi Legislature.
- 32 (3) If an agency finds that an imminent peril to the public
- 33 health, safety or welfare requires adoption of a rule upon fewer
- 34 than thirty (30) days' notice and states in writing its reasons
- 35 for that finding, it may proceed without prior notice of hearing
- 36 or upon any abbreviated notice and hearing that it finds
- 37 practicable to adopt an emergency rule. The rule may be effective
- 38 for a period of not longer than one hundred twenty (120) days,
- 39 renewable once for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, but
- 40 the adoption of an identical rule under subsection (1) of this
- 41 section is not precluded. Rules adopted pursuant to this
- 42 subsection (3) by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks
- 43 may remain effective until thirty (30) days after the first day of
- 44 the next regular session of the Mississippi Legislature.
- 45 (4) No rule hereafter adopted is valid unless adopted in
- 46 substantial compliance with this section. A proceeding to contest
- 47 any rule on the ground of noncompliance with the procedural
- 48 requirements of this section must be commenced within one (1) year
- 49 from the effective date of the rule.
- SECTION 2. Section 49-4-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 51 amended as follows:
- 52 49-4-4. (1) There is hereby created the Mississippi
- 53 Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, to be composed of
- 54 five (5) persons appointed by the Governor, with the advice and
- 55 consent of the Senate, for a term of five (5) years. One (1)
- 56 person shall be appointed from each congressional district. The
- initial terms of the members shall be one (1), two (2), three (3),
- 58 four (4) and five (5) years, respectively. Thereafter, all terms
- 59 shall be for five (5) years. An appointment to fill a vacancy
- 60 which arises for reasons other than by expiration of a term of
- office shall be made from the respective congressional district
- 62 for the unexpired term only.

- (2) The commission shall elect from its membership a

 chairman who shall preside over meetings and a vice chairman who

 shall preside in the absence of the chairman or when the chairman

 shall be excused.
- 67 (3) The commission shall adopt rules and regulations governing times and places for meetings and governing the manner 68 of conducting its business. Each member of the commission shall 69 70 take the oath prescribed by Section 268 of the Constitution, and shall enter into bond in the amount of Thirty Thousand Dollars 71 (\$30,000.00) to be approved by the Secretary of State, conditioned 72 73 according to law, and payable to the State of Mississippi before assuming the duties of office. Any member who shall not attend 74 three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the commission shall be 75 subject to removal by a majority vote of the commission members. 76
- 77 (4) The members of the commission shall receive no annual 78 salary but shall receive per diem compensation as authorized by 79 law for each day devoted to the discharge of official duties and 80 shall be entitled to reimbursement for all actual and necessary 81 expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties, including 82 mileage as authorized by law.
- The commission shall be composed of persons with a 83 84 demonstrated history of involvement in at least one (1) of the matters of jurisdiction of the commission and whose employment and 85 activities are not in conflict. All of the commissioners shall be 86 87 an active outdoorsman holding a resident hunting or fishing license in at least five (5) of the ten (10) years preceding 88 appointment. A member shall not have a record of conviction of 89 violation of fish or game laws and regulations within five (5) 90 years preceding appointment or a record of any felony conviction. 91
- 92 (5) The commission shall have the power to adopt, amend and 93 repeal such regulations and rules, in accordance with the 94 provisions of Section 25-43-7, as may be necessary for the 95 operation of the department.

- 96 (6) The commission shall have the power and authority to 97 issue all licenses and permits under the jurisdiction of the 98 department.
- 99 (7) In the furtherance of its duties and responsibilities, 100 the commission may conduct hearings, gather testimony and perform 101 other functions required to carry out its powers and duties as 102 prescribed by statute.
- 103 (8) The commission shall have all power for conserving,
 104 managing and developing wildlife and fishery resources except for
 105 saltwater aquatic life and marine resources under the jurisdiction
 106 of the Mississippi Commission on Marine Resources.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2003.
