## HOUSE BILL NO. 445

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 25-3-93 AND 25-3-95, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT AGENTS OF THE MISSISSIPPI BUREAU OF NARCOTICS WHO ARE INJURED IN THE LINE OF DUTY MAY NOT BE REQUIRED TO USE PERSONAL OR MAJOR MEDICAL LEAVE DURING THEIR RECOVERY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-3-93, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 25-3-93. (1) (a) Except as provided in subsection (1)(b),
- 10 all employees and appointed officers of the State of Mississippi,
- 11 who are employees as defined in Section 25-3-91, shall be allowed
- 12 credit for personal leave computed as follows:

Leaves of absence granted by 34 the appointing authority for one (1) year or less shall be 35 permitted without forfeiting previously accumulated continuous 36 service. The provisions of this section shall not apply to 37 military leaves of absence. The time for taking personal leave, 38 39 except when such leave is taken due to an illness, shall be determined by the appointing authority of which such employees are 40
- (3) For the purpose of Sections 25-3-91 through 25-3-99, the 42 earned personal leave of each employee shall be credited monthly 43 after the completion of each calendar month of service, and the 44 appointing authority shall not increase the amount of personal 45 46 leave to an employee's credit. It shall be unlawful for an appointing authority to grant personal leave in an amount greater 47 48 than was earned and accumulated by the officer or employee.

Employees are encouraged to use earned personal leave. 50 Personal leave may be used for vacations and personal business as scheduled by the appointing authority and shall be used for 51 illnesses of the employee requiring absences of one (1) day or Accrued personal or compensatory leave shall be used for the first day of an employee's illness requiring his absence of 54 55 more than one (1) day. Accrued personal or compensatory leave may also be used for an illness in the employee's immediate family as 56 defined in Section 25-3-95. There shall be no limit to the 57 58 accumulation of personal leave. Upon termination of employment each employee shall be paid for not more than thirty (30) days of 59 60 accumulated personal leave. Unused personal leave in excess of thirty (30) days shall be counted as creditable service for the

There shall be no maximum limit to major medical 102 leave accumulation. All unused major medical leave shall be counted as creditable service for the purposes of the retirement 103 system as provided in Sections 25-11-103 and 25-13-5. 104 105 Major medical leave may be used for the illness or injury of an employee or member of the employee's immediate family 106 as defined in subsection (3) of this section, only after the 107 108 employee has used one (1) day of accrued personal or compensatory 109 leave for each absence due to illness, or leave without pay if the employee has no accrued personal or compensatory leave. \* \* \* 110 Faculty members employed by the eight (8) public universities on a 111 112 nine-month basis may use major medical leave for the first day of absence due to illness. However, major medical leave may be used, 113 114 without prior use of personal leave, to cover regularly scheduled visits to a doctor's office or a hospital for the continuing 115 116 treatment of a chronic disease, as certified in advance by a 117 physician. For the purposes of this section, "physician" means a doctor of medicine, osteopathy, dental medicine, podiatry or 118 119 chiropractic. For each absence due to illness of thirty-two (32) consecutive working hours (combined personal leave and major 120 medical leave) major medical leave shall be authorized only when 121 certified by their attending physician. 122 An employee may use up to three (3) days of earned major 123 124 medical leave for each occurrence of death in the immediate family requiring the employee's absence from work. No qualifying time or 125 126 use of personal leave will be required prior to use of major 127 medical leave for this purpose. For the purpose of this

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- subsection (3), the immediate family is defined as spouse, parent, 128 stepparent, sibling, child, stepchild, grandchild, grandparent, 129 son- or daughter-in-law, mother- or father-in-law or brother- or 130
- 131 sister-in-law. Child means a biological, adopted or foster child,
- 132 or a child for whom the individual stands or stood in loco
- 133 parentis.
- (4) Employees and appointed officers of the State of 134
- Mississippi having unused, accumulated sick leave or annual leave 135
- earned prior to July 1, 1984, shall be credited with major medical 136
- leave and personal leave as follows: All unused annual leave 137
- 138 shall be credited as personal leave.
- Unused sick leave shall be divided between major medical 139
- leave and personal leave at rates determined by the employee's 140
- sick leave balance on June 30, 1984. The rates of conversion 141
- shall be as follows: 142

- Upon retirement from active employment each faculty 150 member of the state-supported public universities who is employed 151 152 on a nine-month basis shall receive credit and be paid for not more than thirty (30) days of unused major medical leave for 153 service as a state employee. Unused major medical leave in excess 154 155 of thirty (30) days shall be counted as creditable service for the purposes of the retirement system as provided in Sections 156 157 25-11-103 and 25-13-5.
- Any officer of the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol or 158 (6) 159 agent of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics who is injured by 160 wound or accident in the line of duty shall not be required to use

- 161 earned major medical leave during the period of recovery from such
- 162 injury. The appointing authority may not authorize a period of
- 163 recovery which exceeds the time period that the officer or agent
- 164 <u>is unable to perform his duty assignment, as certified by the</u>
- 165 employee's attending physician.
- 166 (7) For the purpose of Sections 25-3-91 through 25-3-99, the
- 167 earned major medical leave of each employee shall be credited
- 168 monthly after the completion of each calendar month, and the
- 169 appointing authority shall not increase the amount of major
- 170 medical leave to an employee's credit. It shall be unlawful for
- 171 an appointing authority to grant major medical leave in an amount
- 172 greater than was earned and accumulated by the officer or
- 173 employee.
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- 175 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 176 and after July 1, 2003.
