the governing board or chief school administrator of the nonpublic school, informs the parents or guardians of the pupil in writing that the public school district and its employees or agents, or the nonpublic school and its employees or agents, shall incur no liability as a result of any injury arising from the

The parents or guardians of the pupil sign a 29 (d) statement acknowledging that the public school district or the 30 nonpublic school shall incur no liability as a result of any 31 injury arising from the self-administration of medication by the 32 33 pupil, and that the parents or guardians shall indemnify and hold harmless the public school district and its employees or agents, 34 or the nonpublic school and its employees or agents, against any 35 claims arising out of the self-administration of medication by the 36 pupil; and 37

The permission is effective for the school year for 38 (e) 39 which it is granted and is renewed for each subsequent school year upon fulfillment of the requirements in paragraphs (a) through (d) 40 41 of this subsection.

(2) A pupil who is permitted to self-administer medication 42 under the provisions of this section shall be permitted to carry 43 an inhaler at all times, provided that the pupil does not endanger 44 himself or other persons through misuse. 45

46 (3) Any person who acts in good faith in accordance with the requirements of this section shall be immune from any civil or 47 criminal liability arising from actions performed under this 48 49 section.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 50 and after July 1, 2003. 51
