HOUSE BILL NO. 618

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 33-11-18, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE THE STATE AUDITOR ANNUALLY TO AUDIT THE CAMP SHELBY 3 TIMBER FUND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 33-11-18, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 33-11-18. (1) In order to conserve and promote timber 8 development at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, the State Forestry 9 Commission is directed to lend its services, advice and 10 recommendations to the Adjutant General of Mississippi in 11 developing a sound timber management program on state-owned lands 12 in said military reservation.

The Adjutant General may sell * * * trees, timber, 13 (2) stumps, naval stores faces or other forest products on state-owned 14 15 lands in the military reservation at Camp Shelby, Mississippi, as shall be recommended by the State Forestry Commission and to 16 secure the services of the State Forestry Commission in the 17 18 reforestation and use of planting, cutting and practices recommended by the State Forestry Commission. The Adjutant 19 General, however, may cut timber to provide clearing for military 20 21 purposes and for rights-of-way without recommendation of the State 22 Forestry Commission, and may sell the timber at the prevailing scale without advertising for bids, when the value thereof is 23 estimated at less than One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 24 (\$1,500.00) by the State Forestry Commission. Based on the 25 26 recommendation and value estimate of the State Forestry Commission, the Adjutant General is authorized to sell at the 27

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prevailing price, without advertising for bids, timber which has 28 29 been damaged by storm, fire, insect, disease or otherwise. Based on recommendations by the State Forestry Commission, as provided 30 by the Timber Management Program, the Adjutant General may dispose 31 32 of nonmarketable timber that is diseased or has been deadened by 33 the State Forestry Commission, authorizing noncommercial public cutting when considered in the best interest of the state. * * * 34 However, * * * before any other sale of timber may be made 35 as * * * authorized in this section, the Adjutant General shall 36 37 advertise for bids on the timber in a newspaper of general circulation in the State of Mississippi at least once each week 38 for three (3) consecutive weeks before the date upon which bids 39 40 are to be received.

The Adjutant General shall pay all of the funds derived from 41 42 any timber and other forest product sales on state-owned lands in said reservation into a special fund in the State Treasury, which 43 shall be a revolving fund, to be used for the maintenance, 44 development and improvement of the military reservation at Camp 45 Shelby, Mississippi, and out of which the Adjutant General may pay 46 47 the State Forestry Commission the cost incurred by the State Forestry Commission in selecting and cutting trees, tree planting, 48 49 elimination of undesirable trees and shrubs, construction of fire lanes, control of insect and disease outbreaks, and other 50 desirable aspects of forest management practices on this military 51 52 reservation for the benefit of this military reservation.

53 The Adjutant General of Mississippi, with concurrence of the 54 <u>State Fiscal Officer</u>, may pay from available Camp Shelby timber 55 funds, restitution for timber *** * *** or minerals cut *** * *** or 56 removed without permission, by employees or authorized agents of 57 the State Military Department, from private property whose sales, 58 use or damage shall have enriched *** * *** or benefited the State 59 Military Department.

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60 The funds derived from any timber and other forest product 61 sales as * * * provided <u>in this section</u> shall be paid by the State 62 Treasurer upon warrants issued by the State Auditor of Public 63 Accounts and the said auditor shall issue his warrant upon 64 requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in 65 the manner provided by law for funds appropriated for support of 66 the Mississippi National Guard.

The Adjutant General shall make an annual report to the Legislature on receipts and disbursements in connection with all funds derived from minerals, timber and other forest product sales on state-owned lands at the Camp Shelby military reservation.

The State Auditor annually shall conduct a legal compliance
 audit of the special fund created under this section.

73 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 74 and after July 1, 2003.
