## HOUSE BILL NO. 738

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-19-33, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO AUTHORIZE COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS TO FINGERPRINT AND 2 3

PERFORM A CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD CHECK ON EVERY EMPLOYEE AND

VOLUNTEER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5

SECTION 1. Section 41-19-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6

amended as follows: 7

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41-19-33. (1) Each region so designated or established 8

9 under Section 41-19-31 shall establish a regional commission to be

composed of members appointed by the boards of supervisors of the 10

various counties in said region. It shall be the duty of such 11

regional commission to administer mental health/retardation 12

programs certified by the State Board of Mental Health. 13

addition, once designated and established as provided hereinabove, 14

a regional commission shall have the following authority and shall 15

pursue and promote the following general purposes: 16

To establish, own, lease, acquire, construct, 17

build, operate and maintain mental illness, mental health, mental 18

retardation, alcoholism and general rehabilitative facilities and

services designed to serve the needs of the people of the region 20

so designated; provided that the services supplied by said 21

regional commissions shall include those services determined by 22

the Department of Mental Health to be necessary and may include, 23

in addition to the above, services for persons with developmental 24

and learning disabilities; for persons suffering from narcotic 25

26 addiction and problems of drug abuse and drug dependence; and for

the aging as designated and certified by the Department of Mental 27

28 Health.

To provide facilities and services for the 29 (b) 30 prevention of mental illness, mental disorders, developmental and learning disabilities, alcoholism, narcotic addiction, drug abuse, 31 drug dependence and other related handicaps or problems (including 32 33 the problems of the aging) among the people of the region so designated, and for the rehabilitation of persons suffering from 34 such illnesses, disorders, handicaps or problems as designated and 35 certified by the Department of Mental Health. 36 (C) To promote increased understanding of the problems 37

of mental illness, mental retardation, alcoholism, developmental 38 39 and learning disabilities, narcotic addiction, drug abuse and drug dependence and other related problems (including the problems of 40 the aging) by the people of the region, and also to promote 41 increased understanding of the purposes and methods of the 42 rehabilitation of persons suffering from such illnesses, 43 disorders, handicaps or problems as designated and certified by 44 the Department of Mental Health. 45

46 (d) To enter into contracts and to make such other arrangements as may be necessary, from time to time, with the 47 48 United States government, the government of the State of Mississippi and such other agencies or governmental bodies as may 49 50 be approved by and acceptable to the regional commission for the purpose of establishing, funding, constructing, operating and 51 maintaining facilities and services for the care, treatment and 52 53 rehabilitation of persons suffering from mental illness, mental retardation, alcoholism, developmental and learning disabilities, 54 55 narcotic addiction, drug abuse, drug dependence and other illnesses, disorders, handicaps and problems (including the 56 problems of the aging) as designated and certified by the 57 Department of Mental Health. 58

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62 private agencies, whether organized for profit or otherwise, as

63 may be approved by and acceptable to the regional commission for

64 the purpose of establishing, funding, constructing, operating and

65 maintaining facilities and services for the care, treatment and

66 rehabilitation of persons suffering from mental illness, mental

67 retardation, alcoholism, developmental and learning disabilities,

68 narcotic addiction, drug abuse, drug dependence and other

69 illnesses, disorders, handicaps and problems (including the

70 problems of the aging) relating to minimum services established by

71 the Department of Mental Health.

- 72 (f) To promote the general mental health of the people
- 73 of the region.
- 74 (g) To pay the administrative costs of the operation of
- 75 said regional commissions, including per diem for the members of
- 76 said commission and its employees, attorney's fees, if and when
- 77 such are required in the opinion of said commission, and such
- 78 other expenses of the commission as may be necessary. The
- 79 Department of Mental Health standards and audit rules shall
- 80 determine what administrative cost figures shall consist of for
- 81 the purposes of this paragraph. Each regional commission shall
- 82 submit a cost report annually to the Department of Mental Health
- 83 in accordance with guidelines promulgated by the department.
- 84 (h) To employ and compensate any personnel that may be
- 85 necessary to effectively carry out the programs and services
- 86 established pursuant to the provisions of the aforesaid act,
- 87 provided such person meets the standards established by the
- 88 Department of Mental Health.
- (i) To acquire whatever hazard, casualty or workers'
- 90 compensation insurance that may be necessary for any property,
- 91 real or personal, owned, leased or rented by said commissions, or
- 92 any employees or personnel hired by the said commissions.

- 93 (j) To acquire professional liability insurance on all
- 94 employees as may be deemed necessary and proper by the commission,

- and to pay, out of the funds of the commission, all premiums due and payable on account thereof.
- 97 (k) To provide and finance within their own facilities,
- 98 or through agreements or contracts with other local, state or
- 99 federal agencies or institutions, nonprofit corporations, or
- 100 political subdivisions or representatives thereof, programs and
- 101 services for the mentally ill, including treatment for alcoholics
- 102 and promulgating and administering of programs to combat drug
- 103 abuse and the mentally retarded.
- 104 (1) To borrow money from private lending institutions
- 105 in order to promote any of the foregoing purposes. A commission
- 106 may pledge collateral, including real estate, to secure the
- 107 repayment of money borrowed under the authority of this paragraph.
- 108 Any such borrowing undertaken by a commission shall be on terms
- 109 and conditions that are prudent in the sound judgment of the
- 110 members of the commission, and the interest on any such loan shall
- 111 not exceed the amount specified in Section 75-17-105. Any money
- 112 borrowed, debts incurred or other obligations undertaken by a
- 113 commission, regardless of whether borrowed, incurred or undertaken
- 114 before or after the effective date of this act, shall be valid,
- 115 binding and enforceable if it or they are borrowed, incurred or
- 116 undertaken for any purpose specified in this section and otherwise
- 117 conform to the requirements of this paragraph.
- 118 (m) To acquire, own and dispose of real and personal
- 119 property. Any real and personal property paid for with state
- 120 and/or county appropriated funds must have the written approval of
- 121 the Department of Mental Health and/or the county board of
- 122 supervisors, depending on the original source of funding, before
- 123 being disposed of under this paragraph.
- 124 (n) To enter into managed care contracts and make such
- 125 other arrangements as may be deemed necessary or appropriate by
- 126 the regional commission in order to participate in any managed
- 127 care program. Any such contract or arrangement affecting more

128 than one (1) region must have prior written approval of the

129 Department of Mental Health before being initiated and annually

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131 (o) To provide facilities and services on a discounted

132 or capitated basis. Any such action when affecting more than one

133 (1) region must have prior written approval of the Department of

Mental Health before being initiated and annually thereafter.

(p) To enter into contracts, agreements or other

arrangements with any person, payor, provider or other entity,

pursuant to which the regional commission assumes financial risk

for the provision or delivery of any services, when deemed to be

necessary or appropriate by the regional commission. Any action

140 under this paragraph affecting more than one (1) region must have

141 prior written approval of the Department of Mental Health before

being initiated and annually thereafter.

143 (q) To provide direct or indirect funding, grants,

144 financial support and assistance for any health maintenance

organization, preferred provider organization or other managed

care entity or contractor, where such organization, entity or

contractor is operated on a nonprofit basis. Any action under

this paragraph affecting more than one (1) region must have prior

written approval of the Department of Mental Health before being

150 initiated and annually thereafter.

(r) To form, establish, operate, and/or be a member of

152 or participant in, either individually or with one or more other

153 regional commissions, any managed care entity as defined in

154 Section 83-41-403(c). Any action under this paragraph affecting

155 more than one (1) region must have prior written approval of the

156 Department of Mental Health before being initiated and annually

157 thereafter.

158 (s) To meet at least annually with the board of

supervisors of each county in its region for the purpose of

- 160 presenting its total annual budget and total mental
- 161 health/retardation services system.
- 162 (t) To provide alternative living arrangements for
- 163 persons with serious mental illness, including, but not limited
- 164 to, group homes for the chronically mentally ill.
- 165 (u) To make purchases and enter into contracts for
- 166 purchasing in compliance with the public purchasing law, Sections
- 167 31-7-12 and 31-7-13, with compliance with the public purchasing
- 168 law subject to audit by the State Department of Audit.
- (v) To insure that all available funds are used for the
- 170 benefit of the mentally ill, mentally retarded, substance abusers
- 171 and developmentally disabled with maximum efficiency and minimum
- 172 administrative cost. At any time a regional commission, and/or
- 173 other related organization whatever it may be, accumulates surplus
- 174 funds in excess of one-half (1/2) of its annual operating budget,
- 175 the entity must submit a plan to the Department of Mental Health
- 176 stating the capital improvements or other projects that require
- 177 such surplus accumulation. If the required plan is not submitted
- 178 within forty-five (45) days of the end of the applicable fiscal
- 179 year, the Department of Mental Health shall withhold all state
- 180 appropriated funds from such regional commission until such time
- 181 as the capital improvement plan is submitted. If the submitted
- 182 capital improvement plan is not accepted by the department, the
- 183 said surplus funds shall be expended by the regional commission in
- 184 the local mental health region on group homes for the mentally
- 185 ill, mentally retarded, substance abusers, children or other
- 186 mental health/retardation services approved by the Department of
- 187 Mental Health.
- 188 (w) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, to
- 189 fingerprint and perform a criminal history record check on every
- 190 <u>employee or volunteer. Every employee or volunteer shall provide</u>
- 191 <u>a valid current social security number and/or driver's license</u>
- 192 <u>number that will be furnished to conduct the criminal history</u>

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- 194 state level, fingerprints shall be forwarded to the Federal Bureau
- 195 of Investigation for a national criminal history record check.
- 196 Each commission is authorized to contract for the performance of
- 197 this requirement if deemed appropriate.
- 198 (x) In general to take any action which will promote,
- 199 either directly or indirectly, any and all of the foregoing
- 200 purposes.
- 201 (2) The types of services established by the State
- 202 Department of Mental Health that must be provided by the regional
- 203 mental health/retardation centers for certification by the
- 204 department, and the minimum levels and standards for those
- 205 services established by the department, shall be provided by the
- 206 regional mental health/retardation centers to children when such
- 207 services are appropriate for children, in the determination of the
- 208 department.
- 209 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 210 and after its passage.
