1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-60-33, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT ANY PERSON WHO OWNS AN AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) THAT IS FOR USE OUTSIDE OF A HEALTH CARE FACILITY MUST HAVE A MISSISSIPPI LICENSED PHYSICIAN REVIEW AND APPROVE THE CLINICAL PROTOCOL FOR THE USE OF THE AED, REVIEW AND ADVISE REGARDING THE TRAINING AND SKILL MAINTENANCE OF THE INTENDED USERS OF THE AED AND ASSURE PROPER REVIEW OF ALL SITUATIONS WHEN THE AED IS USED TO RENDER EMERGENCY CARE; TO PROVIDE IMMUNITY FROM CIVIL LIABILITY FOR THE GOOD FAITH USE OF AN AED TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY CARE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
12	SECTION 1. Section 41-60-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
13	amended as follows:
14	41-60-33. (1) Any person may use an automated external
15	defibrillator for the purpose of saving the life of another person
16	in sudden cardiac death, subject to the following requirements:
17	(a) Any person who owns an AED that is for use outside
18	of a health care facility must have a Mississippi licensed
19	physician review and approve the clinical protocol for the use of
20	the AED, review and advise regarding the training and skill
21	maintenance of the intended users of the AED and assure proper
22	review of all situations when the AED is used to render emergency
23	<pre>care;</pre>

- (b) The person using the AED must have received
 appropriate training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and in
 the use of an AED by the American Heart Association, American Red
 Cross, National Safety Council or other nationally recognized
- 28 course in CPR and AED use;
 29 (c) The AED must be maintained and tested according to
- 30 the manufacturer's operational guidelines, and must not operate in
- 31 a manual mode except when access control devices are in place or

- 32 when appropriately licensed individuals such as registered nurses,
- 33 physicians or emergency medical technician-paramedics utilize the
- 34 AED; and
- 35 (d) Any person who renders emergency care or treatment
- on a person in sudden cardiac death by using an AED must activate
- 37 the EMS system as soon as possible, and report any clinical use of
- 38 the AED to the licensed physician.
- 39 (2) Any person who has had appropriate training, including a
- 40 course in CPR, has demonstrated a proficiency in the use of an
- 41 AED, and who gratuitously and in good faith renders emergency care
- 42 when medically appropriate by use of or provision of an AED,
- 43 without objection of the injured victim or victims thereof, shall
- 44 not be held liable for any civil damages as a result of that care
- or treatment, where the person acts as an ordinarily reasonable,
- 46 prudent person, or with regard to a health care professional,
- 47 including the licensed physician who reviews and approves the
- 48 <u>clinical protocol, as a reasonably prude</u>nt and careful health care
- 49 provider would have acted, under the same or similar
- 50 circumstances.
- 51 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 52 and after July 1, 2003.
