HOUSE BILL NO. 775

1 AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 43-57-1 THROUGH 43-57-9, 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH PROVIDES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A 3 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR PROVIDING SERVICES TO DISABLED PERSONS; TO 4 AMEND SECTION 43-57-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE 5 DATE OF REPEAL ON THE REENACTED SECTIONS FOR ONE YEAR; AND FOR 6 RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 43-57-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
reenacted as follows:

10 43-57-1. The State of Mississippi is committed to providing options to persons with disabilities and families that include 11 members who are persons with disabilities for services to be 12 provided in the most integrated setting appropriate. The State of 13 Mississippi is further committed to developing a comprehensive 14 plan to address needs, service options, opportunities and service 15 settings appropriate for persons with disabilities and families 16 that include members who are persons with disabilities so that 17 they may participate in community life to the greatest extent that 18 is possible and that they desire. 19

20 SECTION 2. Section 43-57-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
21 reenacted as follows:

43-57-3. The following state agencies shall organize a 22 statewide work group to develop a proposed plan: the Department 23 of Mental Health, the State Department of Rehabilitation Services, 24 the Department of Human Services, the State Department of 25 Education, the State Department of Health and the Division of 26 27 Medicaid. The lead agency shall be the Division of Medicaid. The statewide work group shall include any other state agencies that 28 are responsible for providing services to persons with 29

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disabilities or to families that include members who are persons 30 31 with disabilities and any advocacy groups, consumer groups, consumers, providers, provider groups, associations and any other 32 persons, organizations or entities interested in the mission of 33 34 the work group. The work group shall seek input from the public, 35 particularly from persons with disabilities and families that include members who are persons with disabilities. The statewide 36 work group shall submit a recommendation for the proposed plan to 37 the Legislature no later than September 30, 2001. 38 SECTION 3. Section 43-57-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 39 40 reenacted as follows: 43-57-5. In developing the proposed plan, the following 41 42 issues shall be considered: (a) Expansion of home- and community-based services; 43 (b) Prevention of premature or inappropriate 44 out-of-home placement; 45 46 (C) Development of support services and networks, 47 including, but not limited to: Communication services; 48 (i) 49 (ii) Counseling services; (iii) Crisis intervention; 50 51 (iv) Day care; Dental and medical care that are not otherwise 52 (v) 53 covered; 54 (vi) Equipment and supplies and other assistive 55 technology; Financial assistance; 56 (vii) Home and vehicle modifications; 57 (viii) 58 (ix) Home health services; 59 Homemaker services; (x) 60 (xi) Parent education and training; 61 (xii) Personal assistance services; (xiii) Recreation; 62 H. 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63 (xiv) Respite care; 64 (xv) Self-advocacy training; 65 (xvi) Service coordination; 66 (xvii) Specialized diagnosis and evaluation; 67 (xviii) Specialized nutrition and clothing; Specified utility costs; 68 (xix) Therapeutic and nursing services; 69 (xx)70 (xxi) Transportation; (xxii) Vocational and employment supports; 71 Alternative living arrangements, such as 72 (xxiii) 73 group homes and supervised and supported living programs; 74 (xxiv) Housing; Appropriate maintenance of institutional services 75 (d) for those persons with disabilities who desire or need them. 76 77 The proposed plan shall consider any other issues pertinent to the goal of the plan in addition to the issues listed in this 78 79 section. 80 SECTION 4. Section 43-57-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows: 81 82 43-57-7. The following principles shall be considered in the development of the proposed plan: 83 84 (a) Individuals with disabilities and their families are best able to determine their own needs and should be empowered 85 to make decisions concerning necessary, desirable and appropriate 86 87 services. (b) Individuals with disabilities should receive the 88 89 support necessary for them to live as independently as possible at home, if recommended by their treatment team and if they choose. 90 Family support should be responsive to the needs of 91 (C) the entire family unit. 92 Supports should be sensitive to the unique needs 93 (d) 94 and strengths of individuals and families.

97 (f) Supports will usually be needed throughout the life 98 span of the individual who has a disability.

99 (g) Supports should encourage the integration of people 100 with disabilities into the community as much as possible and when 101 recommended by their treatment team and if the consumer prefers 102 that integration.

(h) Support services should be flexible enough to
accommodate unique needs of individuals and families as they
evolve over time.

106 (i) Support services should be consistent with the107 cultural preferences and orientations of individuals and families.

(j) Support services should be comprehensive and coordinated across the agencies that provide resources and services, or both, to individuals and families.

(k) Individual and family home-based support services should be based on the principles for sharing ordinary places, developing meaningful relationships, learning things that are useful and making choices, as well as increasing the self-esteem and status, and enhancing the reputation of the individuals served.

(1) Supports should be developed and expanded in the state that are necessary, desirable and appropriate to support individuals and families.

Supports and services should enhance the 120 (m) development of the individual with a disability and the family. 121 A comprehensive, coordinated system of supports to 122 (n) families effectively uses existing resources and minimizes gaps in 123 124 supports to families and individuals in all areas of the state. Services should be coordinated with other services. 125 (o) 126 (p) No individual who wishes to remain in, or requests 127 services in, an institutional setting will be forced to receive 775 H. B. 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support services in a noninstitutional or home-based setting, including any individual whose professional team determines that an institutional setting is the most integrated and appropriate setting.

132 SECTION 5. Section 43-57-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 133 reenacted as follows:

43-57-9. (1) The proposed plan shall provide the following:
(a) An estimate of the number of persons with
disabilities in the State of Mississippi who need services or will
need services;

(b) An estimate of the amount of appropriations
necessary over the course of the proposed schedule to accomplish
the proposed plan;

(c) A proposal for funding the proposed plan.
(2) It shall be the goal of the proposed plan that, not
later than June 30, 2011, the State of Mississippi will have
available community services for all persons with disabilities
where their professional teams recommend those services and the
persons request those services.

147 SECTION 6. Section 43-57-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 148 amended as follows:

149 43-57-11. Sections 43-57-1 through 43-57-9 shall stand150 repealed on July 1, 2004.

151 **SECTION 7**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 152 and after July 1, 2003.
