HOUSE BILL NO. 1052

- AN ACT TO PROHIBIT THE HARASSING USE OF LASER POINTING
 DEVICES; TO PROHIBIT POSSESSION BY MINORS; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES
 FOR VIOLATIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** (1) It shall be unlawful for a person
- 6 intentionally and without legal justification to focus, point, or
- 7 aim a laser beam directly or indirectly at another person or
- 8 animal in such a manner as to harass, annoy, or injure such person
- 9 or animal.
- 10 (2) It shall be unlawful for a person under eighteen (18)
- 11 years of age to possess a laser pointing device unless the
- 12 possession of such device is necessary for his or her education,
- 13 employment, trade or occupation and it is necessary that such
- 14 device be carries on his or her person.
- 15 (3) Violation of this section shall be a misdemeanor and,
- 16 upon conviction, shall be punishable with a fine not to exceed
- 17 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). If a laser beam is intentionally
- 18 pointed at a law enforcement officer or fire fighter who is
- 19 identifiable in uniform and in performance of his or her duties,
- then the fine shall not exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00).
- 21 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 22 and after July 1, 2003.
