HOUSE BILL NO. 1079

 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 77-9-249, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR MOTORISTS TO FOLLOW WHEN APPROACHING A RAILROAD GRADE CROSSING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
 SECTION 1. Section 77-9-249, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 amended as follows:

7 77-9-249. (1) Whenever any person driving a vehicle approaches a railroad grade crossing under any of the 8 circumstances stated in this subsection, the driver of such 9 vehicle shall stop within fifty (50) feet but not less than 10 fifteen (15) feet from the nearest rail of such railroad, and 11 shall not proceed until he can do so safely. The foregoing 12 13 requirements shall apply when one or more of the following circumstances exists: 14

(a) A clearly visible electric or mechanical signal
device gives warning of the immediate approach of a railroad
train; or

(b) A crossing gate is lowered or when a human flagman
gives or continues to give a signal of the approach or passage of
a railroad train; or

(c) A railroad train approaching within approximately nine hundred (900) feet of the highway crossing emits a signal in accordance with Section 77-9-225, and such railroad train, by reason of its speed or nearness to such crossing, is an immediate hazard; or

26 (d) An approaching railroad train is plainly visible27 and is in hazardous proximity to such crossing.

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(2) No person shall drive any vehicle through, around or
under any crossing gate or barrier at a railroad crossing while
such gate or barrier is closed or is being opened or closed.

(3) In the trial of all actions to recover personal injury 31 32 or property damages, sustained by any driver of such vehicles for 33 collision of said vehicle and train in which action it may appear that the said driver may have violated any of the provisions 34 hereof, the question of whether or not the said violation was the 35 sole or approximate cause of the accident and injury shall be for 36 The violation of this section shall not of 37 the jury to determine. 38 itself defeat recovery, and the question of negligence or the violation aforesaid shall be left to the jury; and the comparative 39 40 negligence statutes and prima facie statute of this state shall apply in these cases as in other cases of negligence. 41

At any railroad grade crossing provided with visible 42 (4)railroad crossbuck signs without automatic electric or mechanical 43 signal devices, crossing gates or a human flagman giving a signal 44 45 of the approach or passage of a train, the driver of a vehicle shall, in obedience to such railroad crossbuck sign, yield the 46 47 right-of-way and slow to a speed reasonable for the existing conditions, and shall stop if required for safety at a clearly 48 49 marked stop line, or if no stop line, within fifty (50) feet, but not less than fifteen (15) feet, from the nearest rail of the 50 railroad, and shall not proceed until he can do so safely. 51

52 (5) Every person, company or corporation violating the 53 provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, 54 upon conviction, shall be fined not less than Two Hundred Fifty 55 Dollars (\$250.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or 56 imprisoned not more than thirty (30) days, or both such fine and 57 imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

58 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 59 and after July 1, 2003.

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
