HOUSE BILL NO. 1084 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO PROVIDE IMMUNITY TO CERTAIN PERSONS SEEKING TO 1 REMEDIATE PROPERTY ON SITES THAT ARE ON THE NATIONAL PRIORITIES 2 3 LIST OF THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY OR THAT ARE PROPOSED TO BE ON THE LIST OR THAT ARE ELIGIBLE TO BE ON THE 4 LIST; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. For purposes of this act, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed in this section, unless 8 the context clearly indicates otherwise: 9

(a) "NPL property subject to restoration" means any
property on a site that is (i) proposed by the United States
Environmental Protection Agency for the National Priorities List
(NPL) but not listed on the NPL; or <u>(ii)</u> listed on the NPL, except
those NPL sites for which the United States Environmental
Protection Agency has issued certificates of completion of the
remediation set forth in the records of decision for those sites.

(b) "Bona fide prospective purchaser" means a person
who acquires ownership of a facility located on NPL property
subject to restoration and who establishes the criteria set forth
in 42 USCS Section 9601(40).

(c) "Owner of NPL property subject to restoration"
means a person who has purchased or otherwise is the owner of
record, other than <u>any person or entity</u> who caused the
contamination, of NPL property subject to restoration.

25 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) If a person who is a bona fide prospective 26 purchaser or owner, other than <u>any person or entity</u> who caused the 27 contamination, of NPL property subject to restoration complies 28 with all requirements of the United States Environmental

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Protection Agency, or state or federal law, which may be imposed with regard to the property, then he shall not be liable to persons other than the United States or the state for contamination or remediation of the NPL property subject to restoration.

34 (2) The immunity provided under this section applies to the
35 following persons to the same extent as to the bona fide
36 prospective purchaser or owner, other than <u>any person or entity</u>
37 who caused the contamination, of the NPL property subject to
38 restoration:

39 Any person under the direction or control of the (a) bona fide prospective purchaser or owner, other than any person or 40 entity who caused the contamination, of NPL property subject to 41 restoration with regard to the remediation or redevelopment of the 42 NPL property subject to restoration, except that such person shall 43 not be immune from any liability which may result from remediating 44 or cleaning the NPL property subject to restoration when he 45 remediates or cleans the property improperly or insufficiently or 46 without complying with any order, rule or regulation of the United 47 48 States Environmental Protection Agency or Department of 49 Environmental Quality or any state or federal law pertaining to 50 the environment; Any future owner, other than any person or entity 51 (b) who caused the contamination, of the NPL property subject to 52 53 restoration; Any person who develops, redevelops or lawfully 54 (C) 55 occupies the NPL property subject to restoration; Any lender or fiduciary that provided financing for 56 (d) remediation or redevelopment of the NPL property subject to 57 restoration; and 58 59 (e) Any successor or assign of a person to whom the

60 immunity granted under this section applies.

No. 1084 03/HR40/R1627PH PAGE 2 (GT\BD) 61 (3) The immunity provided under this section shall be void 62 if a person to whom it is granted fails to comply with any order, 63 rule or regulation of the United States Environmental Protection 64 Agency or the Department of Environmental Quality pertaining to 65 the NPL property subject to restoration, or any state or federal 66 law pertaining to the environment.

(4) This section shall not create a defense against the 67 imposition of criminal, civil or administrative penalties for 68 violations of law on the part of the person to whom the immunity 69 is provided. Further, this section shall not affect the right of 70 71 any person alleged to have suffered damages in connection with the NPL property subject to restoration to seek relief against a 72 73 person other than those described in this section as protected by the immunity. 74

(5) The immunity granted under this section shall not
relieve any person from liability for payment of all costs
reasonably related to the remediation of the NPL property subject
to restoration which are required by the United States
Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of
Environmental Quality.

81 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 82 and after its passage.

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
