HOUSE BILL NO. 1087

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO PROVIDE 1 A VACCINATION PROGRAM FOR FIRST RESPONDERS WHO MAY BE EXPOSED TO 2 3 INFECTIOUS DISEASES WHEN SENT TO BIOTERRORISM OR DISASTER LOCATIONS; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS PROGRAM IS CONDITIONAL UPON THE RECEIPT OF FEDERAL FUNDS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section: "Department" means the Mississippi State Department 8 (a) 9 of Health, Bioterrorism Division; (b) "Director" means the Executive Director of the 10 State Board of Health. 11 (C) "Bioterrorism" means the intentional use of any 12 microorganism, virus, infectious substance or biological product 13 14 that may be engineered as a result of biotechnology or any naturally occurring or bioengineered component of any 15 microorganism, virus, infectious substance or biological product, 16 to cause or attempt to cause death, disease or other biological 17 malfunction in any living organism; 18 "Disaster location" means any geographical location 19 (d) where a bioterrorism attack, terrorist attack, catastrophic or 20 21 natural disaster or emergency occurs; and 22 (e) "First responders" means state and local law 23 enforcement personnel, fire department personnel and emergency medical personnel who will be deployed to bioterrorism attacks, 24 terrorist attacks, catastrophic or natural disasters and 25 emergencies. 26 27 (2) The department shall offer a vaccination program for

28 first responders who may be exposed to infectious diseases when

The vaccinations shall include, but are not limited to, hepatitis A vaccination, hepatitis B vaccination, diptheria-tetanus vaccination, influenza vaccination, pneumococcal vaccination and other vaccinations when recommended by the United States Public Health Service and in accordance with Federal Emergency Management Directors Policy. Immune globulin will be made available when necessary.

36 (3) Participation in the vaccination program will be
37 voluntary on the part of the first responders, except that first
38 responders who may be exposed to blood borne pathogens, as defined
39 by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration Standard
40 contained at 29 CFR 1910.10300, shall be required to take the
41 designated vaccinations.

(4) A first responder shall be exempt from vaccinations when
a written statement from a licensed physician is presented
indicating that a vaccine is medically contraindicated for that
person or the first responder signs a written statement that the
administration of a vaccination conflicts with their religious
tenets.

(5) In the event of a vaccine shortage, the director, in
consultation with the Governor and the Centers for Disease Control
and Prevention, shall give priority for vaccination to first
responders.

52 (6) The department shall notify first responders of the
53 availability of the vaccination program and shall provide
54 educational materials on ways to prevent exposure to infectious
55 diseases.

56 (7) The department may contract with county and local health
57 departments, not-for-profit home health care agencies, hospitals
58 and physicians to administer a vaccination program for first
59 responders.
