## HOUSE BILL NO. 1087 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO PROVIDE 1 A VACCINATION PROGRAM FOR FIRST RESPONDERS WHO MAY BE EXPOSED TO 2 3 INFECTIOUS DISEASES WHEN SENT TO BIOTERRORISM OR DISASTER LOCATIONS; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS PROGRAM IS SUBJECT TO THE RECEIPT OF FEDERAL FUNDS; TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO 4 5 PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL MATERIAL ON THE AVAILABILITY OF VACCINES FOR 6 7 MENINGITIS AND HEPATITIS A AND B TO PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES FOR DISTRIBUTION TO STUDENTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 **SECTION 1.** (1) As used in this section: 10 11 (a) "Department" means the Mississippi State Department of Health, Bioterrorism Division; 12 "Director" means the Executive Director of the 13 (b) State Board of Health; 14 "Bioterrorism" means the intentional use of any 15 (C)microorganism, virus, infectious substance or biological product 16 that may be engineered as a result of biotechnology or any 17 naturally occurring or bioengineered component of any 18 microorganism, virus, infectious substance or biological product, 19 to cause or attempt to cause death, disease or other biological 20 malfunction in any living organism; 21 "Disaster locations" means any geographical 22 (D) 23 location where a bioterrorism attack, terrorist attack, catastrophic or natural disaster or emergency occurs; 24 (e) "First responders" means state and local law 25 enforcement personnel, fire department personnel, emergency 26 medical personnel, emergency management personnel and public works 27 28 personnel who may be deployed to bioterrorism attacks, terrorist attacks, catastrophic or natural disasters and emergencies. 29

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The department shall offer a vaccination program for 30 (2) 31 first responders who may be exposed to infectious diseases when deployed to disaster locations. The vaccinations shall include, 32 33 but are not limited to, hepatitis A vaccination, hepatitis B 34 vaccination, diphtheria-tetanus vaccination, influenza 35 vaccination, pneumococcal vaccination and other vaccinations when recommended by the United States Public Health Service and in 36 accordance with Federal Emergency Management Directors Policy. 37 Immune globulin will be made available when necessary. 38

(3) Participation in the vaccination program shall be voluntary by the first responders, except for first responders who are classified as having "occupational exposure" to blood borne pathogens as defined by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration Standard contained at 29 CFR 1910.10300 who shall be required to take the designated vaccinations or otherwise required by law.

(4) A first responder shall be exempt from vaccinations when
a written statement from a licensed physician is presented
indicating that a vaccine is medically contraindicated for that
person or the first responder signs a written statement that the
administration of a vaccination conflicts with their religious
tenets.

(5) If there is a vaccine shortage, the director, in
consultation with the Governor and the Centers for Disease Control
and Prevention, shall give priority for vaccination to first
responders.

(6) The department shall notify first responders to the
availability of the vaccination program and shall provide
educational materials on ways to prevent exposure to infectious
diseases.

64 (8) This section shall be effective upon receipt of federal
65 funding and/or federal grants for administering a first responders
66 vaccination program. Upon receipt of that funding, the department
67 shall make available the vaccines to first responders as provided
68 in this section.

SECTION 2. The State Department of Health shall prepare 69 written educational information on the risks associated with 70 meningitis and hepatitis A and B and the availability and 71 72 effectiveness of available vaccines for these diseases. The department shall provide this written educational information to 73 the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and 74 the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges to be used to 75 inform students about meningitis and hepatitis A and B. 76 This information shall be sent to students with their letters of 77 acceptance for admission or included in the students' admission 78 79 packets.

80 **SECTION 3**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 81 and after July 1, 2003.
