HOUSE BILL NO. 1232

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-143-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT A LOAN REPAYMENT RECIPIENT UNDER THE MEDICAL 2 EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP AND LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM MUST PRACTICE PRIMARY MEDICAL CARE IN A CRITICAL NEEDS AREA FOR NOT LESS THAN 3 4 TWO YEARS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE RECIPIENT SHALL RECEIVE A LOAN 5 REPAYMENT OF \$40,000.00 FOR THE TWO YEARS OF SERVICE; TO PROVIDE 6 THAT THE RECIPIENT MAY WORK FOR FOUR ADDITIONAL YEARS IN THAT AREA 7 WITH A LOAN REPAYMENT AMOUNT OF \$10,000.00 PER YEAR; AND FOR 8 RELATED PURPOSES. 9

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. Section 37-143-6, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 12 amended as follows:

37-143-6. (1) There is established a medical education 13 scholarship and loan repayment program, which shall be 14 administered by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 15 16 Higher Learning. Each year, the program shall provide a certain number of eligible applicants, if the applicant meets the 17 conditions upon which the scholarship or loan repayment is 18 granted, with: (a) a full scholarship to obtain a medical 19 education at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine at 20 no cost to the recipient; or (b) funds for repaying state and 21 federal medical education loans. 22

The program shall provide scholarships or loan 23 (2) 24 repayments to up to twenty (20) new recipients each year, of which no more than ten (10) may be recipients of loan repayments. 25 The program shall be funded from monies appropriated from the Health 26 Care Expendable Fund established under Section 43-13-407. The 27 amounts that may be expended annually for scholarships and loan 28 29 repayments under the program shall not exceed the following: Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) in fiscal year 2001; One 30

Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in fiscal year 2002; One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) in fiscal year 2003; and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in fiscal year 2004 and in any later fiscal year.

35 (3) A scholarship awarded under this program shall be in an amount that will pay the full cost of attendance, as defined by 36 federal law and regulation, at the University of Mississippi 37 School of Medicine for the entire time necessary for the recipient 38 to complete the requirements for a medical degree. The actual 39 amount of the scholarship shall be determined by the Office of 40 Financial Aid of the University of Mississippi Medical Center but 41 shall not exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per 42 year for any recipient. 43

Before being granted a scholarship, each applicant shall (4) 44 enter into a contract with the board of trustees, which shall be 45 deemed a contract with the State of Mississippi, agreeing to the 46 47 terms and conditions upon which the scholarship will be granted. In order to receive a scholarship under the program, the recipient 48 must agree in the contract to practice family medicine for a 49 50 period of not less than ten (10) years after completion of his or her residency in an area of the state that is a critical needs 51 52 area for primary medical care at the time of the recipient's entry into medical practice. The determination and designation of the 53 areas of the state that are critical needs areas for primary 54 55 medical care in which scholarship recipients may practice shall be made by a committee to be known as the Medical Care Critical Needs 56 57 Committee, which shall be composed of the following persons: the Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs of the University of 58 Mississippi Medical Center, who shall be chairman of the 59 committee; the Executive Director of the State Department of 60 Health; the Executive Director of the Division of Medicaid; the 61 62 President of the Mississippi State Medical Association or his designee; the President of the Mississippi State Hospital 63

No. 1232 03/HR07/R1684 PAGE 2 (AN\HS) Association or his designee; the President of the Mississippi Academy of Family Physicians; and the Executive Director of the Mississippi Primary Health Care Association. The committee shall meet at least once annually to determine and designate the areas of the state that are critical needs areas for primary medical care in which scholarship recipients may practice family medicine in order to fulfill their contractual obligation.

(5) Beginning on July 1, 2001, the Board of Trustees of 71 (a) State Institutions of Higher Learning may use any funds available 72 under the medical education scholarship and loan repayment program 73 74 for repaying state and federal medical education loans made to licensed family medicine physicians who agree to practice family 75 76 medicine for a period of not less than two (2) years in an area of the state that is a critical needs area for primary medical care, 77 as designated by the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee. 78 For the first two (2) years of practice of family medicine in a 79 critical needs area for primary medical care, the recipient shall 80 receive a state loan repayment in the amount of Forty Thousand 81 Dollars (\$40,000.00). For each additional year of family medicine 82 practice in that area after two (2) years, for a maximum of four 83 (4) additional years, the recipient shall receive a state loan 84 85 repayment in the amount of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for each additional year of practice. The board of trustees shall use 86 any funds available under the Medical Education Scholarship and 87 Loan Repayment Program to apply for and receive federal matching 88 funds from the National Health Service Corps to assist in the 89 90 repayment of qualified educational loans for primary health care clinicians who agree to practice in a critical needs area for 91 primary medical care. In order to receive a state loan repayment 92 under this section, an applicant must enter into a contract with 93 the board of trustees, which shall be deemed a contract with the 94 95 State of Mississippi, agreeing to the terms and conditions upon which the loan repayment will be granted. The contract must 96

include all conditions specified under subsection (4) for 97 scholarship recipients; however, for a loan repayment, the minimum 98 period of service required in an area of the state that is a 99 100 critical needs area for primary medical care at the time the 101 contract is executed is two (2) years. The contract also must 102 specify the total amount of the loan repayment and a schedule for making payments to the recipient, based upon the recommendation of 103 the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee. 104

(b) The board of trustees shall give priority in
awarding loan repayments to family medicine physicians according
to the following:

(i) University of Mississippi School of Medicine
graduates or persons who have completed successfully a full
three-year family medicine residency training program in the State
of Mississippi;

(ii) Persons who were born in Mississippi who have completed training in a certified family medicine residency program outside the State of Mississippi; and

(iii) Physicians who are practicing outside the State of Mississippi who received training at a medical school outside the state and who are board certified in family practice.

The Medical Care Critical Needs Committee shall 118 (C) meet at least once annually to determine and designate the areas 119 of the state that are critical needs areas for primary medical 120 121 care in which loan repayment recipients may practice family medicine and other primary care health professional disciplines in 122 order to fulfill their contractual obligation. The committee also 123 shall determine the priority of additional primary health care 124 clinicians who are eligible to participate in the state loan 125 repayment program using any National Health Service Corps matching 126 funds or other funds excluding funds appropriated by the 127 128 Legislature.

No. 1232 03/HR07/R1684 PAGE 4 (AN\HS) If a scholarship recipient leaves the University of (6) 129 Mississippi School of Medicine before graduation, or leaves his or 130 her residency before completion, or fails to practice family 131 132 medicine for a period of ten (10) years in a critical needs area 133 for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee under subsection (4) of this section, the 134 full amount that the recipient received under the scholarship 135 shall be due and payable within ninety (90) days, together with 136 137 interest. If a loan repayment recipient fails to practice family medicine for a period of two (2) years in a critical needs area 138 139 for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee under subsection (5)(c) of this section, 140 the full amount that the recipient received for loan repayments 141 shall be due and payable within ninety (90) days, together with 142 interest. The amount of interest due shall be equal to the annual 143 rate of return on the Health Care Trust Fund established under 144 Section 43-13-405 for each year from the time the recipient 145 146 received the scholarship or loan repayment money until the time the scholarship or loan repayment money is repaid. The board of 147 148 trustees may bring suit against any scholarship or loan repayment recipient to recover the amount due to the state under this 149 150 section for the recipient's failure to comply with the conditions 151 upon which the scholarship or loan repayment was granted, as provided in this section and in the contract between the recipient 152 153 and the board of trustees. The board of trustees is authorized to postpone or forgive the repayment of all or part of the amount 154 155 that a recipient received under the scholarship or for loan repayments and the interest that would otherwise be due under this 156 subsection if the recipient's failure to comply with the 157 158 conditions upon which the scholarship or loan repayment was granted was due to circumstances beyond the recipient's control 159 160 that caused the recipient to be physically unable to comply with

(7) The board of trustees shall establish such rules and
regulations, based upon recommendations submitted by the Medical
Care Critical Needs Committee, which it deems necessary and proper
to carry out the purposes and intent of this section.

167 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 168 and after July 1, 2003.
