HOUSE BILL NO. 1364

AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI CHILD EQUITY TRUST FUND; TO 1 REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND THE PUBLIC EMPLOYEES' 2 RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO IMPLEMENT THE TRUST FUND; TO REQUIRE THE CREATION OF AN EARLY CHILDHOOD NONATTENDANCE REGISTRATION 3 4 CERTIFICATE FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO ELECT NOT TO ENROLL IN MISSISSIPPI 5 EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION; TO PROVIDE THAT NO PERSON SHALL BE 6 ELIGIBLE FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE TRUST FUND UNLESS A CERTIFICATE 7 WAS FILED ON HIS BEHALF; TO REQUIRE THE DEPOSIT OF CERTAIN FUNDS 8 INTO THE TRUST FUND ON BEHALF OF EACH INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS FILED A 9 CERTIFICATE; TO REQUIRE THE INVESTMENT SECTION OF THE PUBLIC 10 EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO INVEST THE FUNDS; TO REQUIRE THAT 11 THE MONEY IN THE TRUST BE PAID OUT TO THE CHILD WHEN CERTAIN 12 CONDITIONS ARE MET; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 13

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. (1) There is created in the Public Employees' 15 Retirement System a special trust fund to be known as the 16 "Mississippi Child Equity Trust Fund," which shall be administered 17 18 by the State Superintendent of Public Education and the Public Employees' Retirement System. The money for the fund shall come 19 from certain funds due to school districts under the Adequate 20 21 Education Program. These funds shall be transferred to and managed by the Public Employees' Retirement System. 22

(2) The State Superintendent of Public Education shall
 promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of the
 program.

(3) To facilitate the administration of this act, the State
Superintendent of Public Education shall develop an early
childhood nonattendance registration certificate which shall be
made available to the parent, guardian or custodian of any
kindergarten-age child at the same location that the child is
eligible to be enrolled in the Mississippi Early Childhood

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32 Education Program. The certificate shall be designed to obtain 33 the following information:

34 (a) The name, address and date of birth of any early
35 childhood-age child who is eligible to enroll in the Mississippi
36 Early Childhood Education Program;

37 (b) The name and address of the parent, guardian or38 custodian of the early childhood-age child;

39 (c) Certification that the parent, guardian or 40 custodian of the kindergarten-age child has elected not to enroll 41 the child in the Mississippi Early Childhood Education Program; 42 and

(d) The signature of the parent, guardian or custodianof the early childhood-age child and the date signed.

The State Superintendent of Public Education shall furnish a sufficient number of the early childhood nonattendance registration certificates to each school district each year when the program is implemented.

(4) The failure of a parent, guardian or custodian of any
kindergarten-age child eligible to enroll in the Mississippi Early
Childhood Education Program to complete a kindergarten
nonattendance registration certificate is not unlawful; however,
failure to properly complete and submit the early childhood
nonattendance registration certificate shall prevent funds from
being transferred to the child's account for that year.

56 (5) Before September 16 of each year, each school district shall submit to the State Superintendent of Public Education a 57 58 copy of each early childhood nonattendance registration certificate received for the current school year. 59 The state superintendent shall deposit each child's pro rata part of 60 Adequate Education Program funds to the child's personal Child 61 Equity Trust Fund Account. For children not enrolling in 62 63 kindergarten, the amount shall be the statewide per capita Adequate Education Program funding for that year. 64 For children

No. 1364 03/HR40/R1196 PAGE 2 (AN\BD) electing to attend first, second and third grade classes not 65 66 having assistant teachers, the amount shall be that child's per capita share of assistant teacher salaries and benefits for that 67 68 The district shall provide classes both with and without year. 69 assistant teachers. The district may place a child having an 70 early childhood nonattendance registration certificate in a class served by an assistant teacher in order to solve scheduling 71 difficulties. The contribution to the child's trust fund account 72 shall not be reduced because of such placement. If extra funds 73 74 are needed to supplement the assistant teacher salary, the funds 75 shall be taken on an equal percentage basis from the salaries of all administrators in the district. Kindergarten, first, second 76 77 and third grade children who attend private schools or are officially in home school are eligible to participate in the 78 Mississippi Child Equity Trust Fund. A child must be a citizen of 79 the United States and a resident of Mississippi to participate in 80 this program. Parents, guardians or custodians of private and 81 82 home school children shall complete the early childhood nonattendance registration certificate in the same manner as those 83 84 attending public school. The superintendent of the public school district shall furnish the forms and collect and transmit these 85 86 forms to the State Superintendent of Public Education.

(6) The State Superintendent of Public Education shall 87 transfer the funds deposited to each child's account to the Public 88 89 Employees' Retirement System each year along with an accounting of the amount to be credited to each child's account. The retirement 90 91 system shall administer the Child Equity Trust Fund separate from other funds it manages. At least once per year, the earnings of 92 each individual account shall be credited to that account. 93 This fund shall be managed and audited in the same manner as funds in 94 95 the other accounts managed by the Public Employees' Retirement 96 System.

No. 1364 03/HR40/R1196 PAGE 3 (AN\BD) A child who has an account in the Child Equity Trust 97 (7) Fund may claim the funds to go to college, trade school or for 98 other legitimate educational activity on or after reaching 99 100 eighteen (18) years of age or graduating from high school. For 101 children under eighteen (18) years of age, the funds shall be disbursed to the parent, guardian or custodian by the Public 102 103 Employees' Retirement System upon receipt of a certificate of admission of the child to a legitimate educational entity. The 104 State Department of Education shall maintain a list of 105 educational entities deemed legitimate for purposes of this act. 106 For children over eighteen (18) years of age, all funds in an 107 108 individual's account shall be disbursed directly to the individual upon receipt of a certificate of admission of the child to a 109 legitimate educational entity. Any time after the child reaches 110 twenty-five (25) years of age, the funds may be transferred 111 directly to the child without restrictions. 112

(8) For the purposes of this act, "early childhood education" includes public school kindergarten and public school first grade, second grade and third grade classes having an assistant teacher in addition to the regular teacher.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2003.
