HOUSE BILL NO. 1438

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-59-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DIRECT THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS TO PROVIDE THAT A FIRST RESPONDER WILL NOT BE REQUIRED TO BE UNDER
- 4 MEDICAL CONTROL UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; TO AMEND SECTION
- 5 41-59-83, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE PRECEDING
- 6 PROVISION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 41-59-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 41-59-81. The * * * State Board of Health may promulgate and
- 11 enforce rules and regulations to provide for the best and most
- 12 effective emergency medical care, and to comply with national
- 13 standards for first responder basic life support. Notwithstanding
- 14 any other provision of law, first responder personnel may be
- 15 authorized to provide first responder basic life support services
- 16 as defined by rules and regulations promulgated by the State Board
- 17 of Health.
- Rules and regulations promulgated under this authority shall,
- 19 as a minimum:
- 20 (a) Define and authorize functions and training
- 21 programs for first responder personnel. All those training
- 22 programs shall meet or exceed the performance requirements of the
- 23 most current training program "First Responder: National Standard
- 24 Curriculum" as developed by the United States Department of
- 25 Transportation, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.
- 26 (b) Specify minimum operational requirements that will
- 27 include, but not be limited to, medical control over the
- 28 administration of a dose of epinephrine from an auto-injector.

29	(c) Specify minimum testing and certification
30	requirements and provide for continuing education and periodic
31	recertification for all first responder personnel.
32	(d) Provide that a first responder will not be required
33	to be under medical control if the first responder (i) is located
34	in a county that does not have a hospital, or (ii) is without the
35	ability to obtain appropriate medical control within the county in
36	which the first responder is located.
37	SECTION 2. Section 41-59-83, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
38	amended as follows:
39	41-59-83. When authorized by medical direction, except as
40	otherwise provided in Section 41-59-81(d), a first responder, an
41	emergency medical technician-basic, an emergency medical
42	technician-intermediate or an emergency medical
43	technician-paramedic may carry and administer, or aid in the
44	administration of, a dose of epinephrine from an auto-injector to
45	treat persons experiencing allergic reactions and anaphylaxis.
46	SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act shall take effect and be in

force from and after July 1, 2003, and Section 2 of this act shall

take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2004.

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
