HOUSE BILL NO. 1442

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-36, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REQUIRE THE COMPENSATION FOR JUSTICE COURT JUDGES TO BE BASED UPON 2 POPULATION ACCORDING TO THE MOST RECENT FEDERAL DECENNIAL CENSUS; 3 4 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-36, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 25-3-36. (1) From and after the effective date of House 8 Bill No. , 2003 Regular Session, every justice court judge 9 shall receive as full compensation for his or her services * * * 10 an annual salary based upon the population of his or her county 11 according to the most recent federal decennial census * * *. The 12 amount of the salary shall be determined as follows: 13 In counties with a population of more than two (a) 14 hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Forty-six Thousand Two 15 Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$46,299.00). 16 17 (b) In counties with a population of more than one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) but not more than two hundred 18 thousand (200,000), a salary of Forty-two Thousand Five Hundred 19 Four Dollars (\$42,504.00). 20 (C) In counties with a population of more than 21 seventy-five thousand (75,000) but not more than one hundred fifty 22 thousand (150,000), a salary of Thirty-eight Thousand Seven 23 Hundred Nine Dollars (\$38,709.00). 24 In counties with a population of more than 25 (\mathbf{D}) forty-nine thousand (49,000) but not more than seventy-five 26 thousand (75,000), a salary of Thirty-three Thousand Three Hundred 27 Ninety-six Dollars (\$33,396.00). 28 H. (e) In counties with a population of more than
thirty-four thousand (34,000) but not more than forty-nine
thousand (49,000), a salary of Twenty-eight Thousand Eight Hundred
Forty-two Dollars (\$28,842.00).

33 (f) In counties with a population of more than 34 twenty-four thousand five hundred (24,500) but not more than 35 thirty-four thousand (34,000), a salary of Twenty-seven Thousand 36 Three Hundred Twenty-four Dollars (\$27,324.00).

37 (g) In counties with a population of more than
38 twenty-one thousand (21,000) but not more than twenty-four
39 thousand five hundred (24,500), a salary of Twenty-four Thousand
40 Two Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars (\$24,288.00).

(h) In counties with a population of more than sixteen
thousand five hundred (16,500) but not more than twenty-one
thousand (21,000), a salary of Twenty-one Thousand Two Hundred
Fifty-two Dollars (\$21,252.00).

(i) In counties with a population of more than twelve
thousand (12,000) but not more than sixteen thousand five hundred
(16,500), a salary of Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixteen
Dollars (\$18,216.00).

(j) In counties with a population of more than eight
thousand (8,000) but not more than twelve thousand (12,000), a
salary of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00).

(k) In counties with a population of eight thousand
(8,000) or less, a salary of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00).

The board of supervisors of any county having two (2) 54 judicial districts and two (2) justice court judges for the county 55 shall pay each justice court judge an amount equal to that * * * 56 provided in this subsection for judges in the next higher 57 population category per year, if the justice court judge maintains 58 regular office hours and is personally present in the office the 59 60 judge maintains for at least thirty (30) hours per week. In any county having a population greater than eight thousand (8,000) but 61

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less than eight thousand five hundred (8,500) according to the 62 63 1990 federal decennial census and in which U.S. Highway 61 and Mississippi Highway 4 intersect, the board of supervisors * * *, 64 65 in its discretion, may pay such justice court judges an additional 66 amount not to exceed the sum of Eleven Thousand Five Hundred Fifty 67 Dollars (\$11,550.00) per year * * *. In any county having a population greater than ten thousand (10,000) but less than ten 68 thousand five hundred (10,500) according to the 1990 federal 69 70 decennial census and in which Mississippi Highway 3 and Mississippi Highway 6 intersect, the board of supervisors * * *, 71 72 in its discretion, may pay such justice court judges an additional amount not to exceed One Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars 73 74 (\$1,450.00) per year * * *. In any county having a population greater than twenty-four thousand seven hundred (24,700) and less 75 76 than twenty-four thousand nine hundred (24,900), according to the 1990 federal census, wherein Mississippi Highways 15 and 16 77 78 intersect, the board of supervisors shall pay such justice court 79 judge an additional amount equal to Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) per year. 80

81 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, in the event that the number of justice court judges 82 83 authorized pursuant to Section 9-11-2(1) is exceeded pursuant to the provisions of Section 9-11-2(4), the aggregate of the salaries 84 paid to the justice court judges of such a county shall not exceed 85 the amount sufficient to pay the number of justice court judges 86 authorized pursuant to Section 9-11-2(1), and such amount shall be 87 88 equally divided among those justice court judges continuing to hold office under the provisions of Section 9-11-2(4). 89

90 (3) From and after January 1, 1984, all fees, costs, fines 91 and penalties charged and collected in the justice court shall be 92 paid to the clerk of the justice court for deposit, along with 93 monies from cash bonds and other monies which have been forfeited 94 in criminal cases, into the general fund of the county as provided

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in Section 9-11-19; and the clerk of the board of supervisors 95 96 shall be authorized and empowered, upon approval by the board of supervisors, to make disbursements and withdrawals from the 97 general fund of the county in order to pay any reasonable and 98 99 necessary expenses incurred in complying with this section, 100 including payment of the salaries of justice court judges as provided by subsection (1) of this section. The provisions of 101 102 this subsection shall not, except as to cash bonds and other monies which have been forfeited in criminal cases, apply to 103 monies required to be deposited in the justice court clerk 104 105 clearing account as provided in Section 9-11-18.

The salaries provided for in subsection (1) of this 106 (4) 107 section shall be payable monthly by warrant drawn by the clerk of the board of supervisors on the general fund of the county; 108 109 however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be 110 paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. 111 Ιf 112 a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or 113 114 legal holiday.

(5) * * * The salary of <u>a</u> justice court judge shall not be reduced during his term of office as a result of a population change following a federal decennial census.

(6) Any justice court judge who is unable to attend and hold court by reason of being under suspension by the Commission on Judicial Performance or the Mississippi Supreme Court shall not receive a salary while under such suspension.

SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the

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127 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 128 extended.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 129 and after October 1, 2003, if it is effectuated on or before that 130 131 date under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended. If it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 132 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, after October 1, 133 2003, this act shall take effect and be in force from and after 134 the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights 135 Act of 1965, as amended and extended. 136
