## HOUSE BILL NO. 1546 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2004.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004
10	\$ 19,811,525.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004
18	\$ 9,366,825.00.
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement
22	Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
23	Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
24	improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
25	the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
26	Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.
27	Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall

20	pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.
29	Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into
30	the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such
31	money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."
32	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
33	Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall
34	be expended for the respective major objects or purposes of
35	expenditure:

56	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
57	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
58	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
59	Services" for Fiscal Year 2005 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2004
60	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions

pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.

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- are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2005 budget by the
- 62 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
- 63 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
- 64 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
- 65 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
- 66 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure
- 67 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual
- 68 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2004 appropriation for "Personal
- 69 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month,
- 70 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken
- 71 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected
- 72 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2004 "Personal Services"
- 73 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 74 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 75 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 76 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 77 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 78 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.
- 79 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 80 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 81 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 82 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 83 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 84 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the
- 85 Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds
- 86 generated from the Forest Acreage Tax, and with funds generated
- 87 from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites an amount
- 88 not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00).
- 89 It is further the intention of the Legislature that the State
- 90 Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the
- 91 Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of expenditure, with
- 92 funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund the Forest Resource
- 93 Development Program in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred

- 94 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). The receipt of these funds is
- 95 hereby authorized and approved, provided such receipts and
- 96 expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in
- 97 accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seg. and Section 27-104-1 et
- 98 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 99 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 100 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate part-time
- 101 positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed
- 102 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of
- 103 funds that become available to the commission. This escalation
- 104 shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the
- 105 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent
- 106 with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used
- 107 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme
- 108 wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day.
- 109 The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds
- 110 shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written
- 111 notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal
- 112 Officer.
- 113 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the State Legislature that
- 114 as soon as funds come available that the Forestry Commission
- 115 Career Ladder be implemented.
- 116 **SECTION 7.** The Forestry Commission has the authority to
- 117 purchase from the "General Services Administration" Fire Fighter
- 118 Catalog and any other GSA Catalog as long as the cost of such
- 119 items are less than the quotes received.
- 120 **SECTION 8.** There is hereby created in the State Treasury a
- 121 fund designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment
- 122 Conversion Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry

- 123 Commission to assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the
- 124 State Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal
- 125 Property Program or by Volunteer Fire Departments through other
- 126 means to adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires.

This assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks
or other accessories necessary for the operation of fire
suppression units, installation of piping and valves, painting or
other similar or associated component work necessary to place fire
suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle
maintenance or repair.

The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and services performed for Volunteer Fire Departments by the State Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.

The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire

Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not

exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of

Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State

Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies

in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and

shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.

Executive Director of the State Forestry Commission may authorize increases in major objects of expenditure in total amounts not to exceed twenty percent (20%) of the appropriated amount of each major object of expenditure, provided that other major objects of expenditure are decreased by the corresponding dollar amount. However, no transfers shall be authorized which increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits."

SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon

- warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
  Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
  proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

  SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 164 and after July 1, 2003.
