HOUSE BILL NO. 1550 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND 1 MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR 2 3 THE FISCAL YEAR 2004. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and 7 maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for 8 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004 9 10,360,779.00. 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 12 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source 14 funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for 15 the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004..... 17 18\$ 50,050,841.00. The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated 19 above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state 20 21 excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning 22 July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004..... \$ 5,750,000.00. 23 The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the 24 amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it 25 26 sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside 27

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from such funds before making distribution thereof. However, provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund, as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of 1972.

Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as authorized by law during Fiscal Year 2003. The department shall make a detailed report to the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage funds by September 1 for the preceding Fiscal Year 2003.

39 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 40 Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the 41 amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred 42 Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the 43 Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 44 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of 45 defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2004.

46 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 47 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 48 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and 49 Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty 50 Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, 51 protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and 52 wildlife of this state.

53 **SECTION 5.** With the funds appropriated under the provisions 54 of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized: 55 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:

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Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be furnished
an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Four Hundred Fifty Dollars
(\$450.00) per annum.

Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one county to another on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.

67 SECTION 6. With the funds appropriated herein, it is the 68 intention of the Legislature that a reasonable number of 69 Conservation Officers, Conservation Officer Supervisors, District 70 Managers, Area Managers, and Lake Managers shall be employed 71 and/or detailed to both temporary and permanent job assignments in 72 areas other than their county of residence.

SECTION 7. With the funds appropriated herein, the 73 Mississippi Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall 74 adopt rules and regulations to permit the building, equipment and 75 facilities of the Mississippi Museum of Natural Science, or any 76 77 portion thereof, to be used by individuals, organizations, associations or other groups or entities for special events, 78 79 occasions or activities. Such rules and regulations may authorize the commission to establish and collect reasonable fees and 80 81 charges for the use of such building, equipment and facilities, shall authorize such building, equipment and facilities to be used 82 for such purposes during the regular operating hours of the museum 83 as well as after regular operating hours or at other times when 84 such use will not unreasonably interfere with access to the museum 85 86 by the general public, may require users to provide security in the form of cash deposits, bond and/or insurance for the care and 87 safekeeping of the building, equipment and facilities, may require 88 users to enter into indemnity agreements to protect the state, its 89 agencies and its officers and employees from liability and may 90 91 authorize the commission to establish such other terms,

92 conditions, restrictions and limitations from time to time as the

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93 commission deems advisable with regard to the use of the museum 94 and its building, equipment and facilities.

SECTION 8. With the funds herein appropriated, it is the 95 96 intention of the Legislature that it shall be the agency's 97 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2005 do not 98 exceed Fiscal Year 2004 funds appropriated for that purpose, 99 unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 100 101 2005 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel 102 103 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to 104 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the 105 provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 106 agency head to insure that no single personnel action increases 107 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2004 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized. If, at the 108 end of any calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines 109 110 that the agency has taken action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2004 111 112 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the 113 114 appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel 115 Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are 116 met.

117 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 118 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the following amount shall come from the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Special Pearl River Timber Fund No. 3465, for

SECTION 10. The board of supervisors of any county or any 128 129 group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and 130 empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the 131 purpose of creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and 132 fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within 133 such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is 134 empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not 135 136 exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall 137 reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the 138 actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by 139 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental 140 thereto. Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and 141 empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary 142 143 to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the United States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be 144 145 necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for 146 such purposes.

The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 147 SECTION 11. is hereby directed to keep an exact accounting of the funds 148 received during each fiscal year by fund and source and an exact 149 150 accounting of how these funds were expended by fund and program/division. Such information shall be provided to the House 151 152 and Senate Appropriations Chairmen, Chairman of the House Game and 153 Fish Committee and Chairman of the Senate Wildlife and Fisheries Committee no later than October 1 following the end of the fiscal 154 155 year.

156 **SECTION 12.** The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 157 is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Pearl River 158 Valley Water Supply District to provide for financial support of

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159 an additional conservation officer on and around the Ross Barnett 160 Reservoir.

161 The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to 162 escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and 163 Parks for this purpose.

SECTION 13. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

170 It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles 171 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply 172 with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), that may become available to the department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration.

SECTION 15. In order to be in compliance with Sections 63-1-74 through 63-1-79, funds are herein provided and may be expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.

SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Mississippi Development Authority in the amount of Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000.00) as authorized in Section 57-61-32 (1), Mississippi

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191 Code of 1972. Such funds are to be used to defray the cost of 192 constructing a North Mississippi Fish Hatchery.

193 SECTION 17. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, 194 Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of 195 One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) and to enter into 196 an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service 197 for a biology specialist and related supportive cost.

The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for this purpose.

SECTION 18. It is the intention of the Legislature that PIN 8102 shall be converted from time-limited full time to permanent full time status.

SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 2.04 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain 205 206 complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 207 208 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2003. It is further the intention of 209 210 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2005 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 211 212 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2004 budget request 213 214 process.

SECTION 20. It is the intention of the Legislature that a DWFP-Conservation Officer I position be established and filled to be assigned to manage the Mason Creek Game Management Area. Furthermore, it is the intention of the Legislature that a Statewide Coordinator for the Recruitment and Retention of Hunting and Fishing be established and filled to be assigned to the Central Office.

222 **SECTION 21.** Of the funds in Section 2, the department shall 223 implement a One Thousand Dollar (\$1,000.00) realignment to the

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225 DWFP-Conservation Officer II, DWFP-Conservation Officer III,

226 DWFP-Conservation Officer IV, DWFP-Conservation Manager,

DWFP-Conservation Supervisor, DWFP-Special Operations Agent I,
 DWFP-Special Operations Agent II, and DWFP-Special Operations
 Agent III.

230 **SECTION 22.** Of the funds in Section 2, the Department shall 231 be authorized to purchase and implement a satellite communications 232 system in an amount not to exceed Two Million Two Hundred Thousand 233 Dollars (\$2,200,000.00).

234 SECTION 23. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 235 236 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 237 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 238 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 239 SECTION 24. This act shall take effect and be in force from 240 241 and after July 1, 2003.
