HOUSE BILL NO. 1609

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF OKTIBBEHA 2 COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI, TO ESTABLISH A COUNTY COURT; TO PROVIDE FOR 3 THE ELECTION OF ONE COUNTY COURT JUDGE FOR THE COURT; AND FOR 4 RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 **SECTION 1.** (1) The Board of Supervisors of Oktibbeha 7 County, Mississippi, in its discretion, may establish a county 8 court in Oktibbeha County.

9 (2) There shall be one (1) county court judge elected for the county court established in subsection (1) of this section. 10 The initial holder of the judgeship created by this section shall 11 be elected at a special election to be held at the same time as 12 the general election in November 2003. Candidates for the county 13 court judge shall qualify to run not later than forty-five (45) 14 days before that election. The person elected as county court 15 judge shall begin the term of office on the first day of January 16 17 2004 and serve until January 2007. Beginning with the general election in November 2006, the county court judge of Oktibbeha 18 County shall be elected at the same time and in the same manner as 19 provided for county judges in the general laws of this state. 20

(3) Except as provided in subsections (1) and (2) of this section, the county court established and the county court judge elected under this section shall be governed by all applicable general laws of this state regarding county courts and county court judges.

SECTION 2. The Board of Supervisors of Oktibbeha County
shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
