- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF
- MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi 6
- 7 Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the

- 9 Amend Section 70, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- as follows: 10
- "Section 70. No revenue bill, or any bill providing for 11
- assessments of property for taxation, shall become a law except by 12
- a vote of at least three-fifths (3/5) of the members of each house 13
- present and voting. For the purposes of this section, a bill is 14
- not a revenue bill because it provides for a reduction in taxes, 15
- and only a majority vote of the members of each house present and 16
- 17 voting may be required by the Legislature for passage of any such
- 18 bill."
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be 19
- submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at 20
- an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday 21
- of November 2003 as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution 22
- 23 and by general law.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed 24
- amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed 25
- 26 amendment provides that bills that reduce taxes require only a
- 27 majority vote for passage."
