- 11 Catholic University of America, Bishop Houck was ordained a Priest
- 12 for the Diocese of Mobile on May 19, 1951, at the Basilica of the
- 13 Immaculate Conception; and
- 14 WHEREAS, throughout his long and distinguished career in the
- 15 Catholic church, Bishop Houck has performed pastoral work in
- 16 parishes in Alabama and Florida; served in teaching and
- 17 administrative positions in Catholic schools in Alabama and
- 18 Florida; served as Superintendent of Catholic Schools in Alabama;
- 19 and served as Secretary of Education in Alabama; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Bishop Houck was ordained a Bishop by Pope John Paul
- 21 II on May 27, 1979, at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, Italy; and
- 22 WHEREAS, in 1979, Bishop Houck served as Auxiliary Bishop to
- 23 Bishop Joseph Brunini before being installed as the ninth Bishop
- 24 of the Catholic Diocese of Jackson on June 5, 1984, which
- 25 encompasses 65 of the 82 counties in central and northern
- 26 Mississippi; and
