- 1948 with a degree in business administration, Mr. Irby continued 8
- his education at the Graduate Institute of Internal Studies in 9

- served three years in the United States Army during World War II, 12
- 13 where his unit landed at Normandy approximately six days after

- Construction Company built power lines in 42 states and completed 19
- 12 international projects in Asia, Africa and Central America; and 20

- success allowed the Stuart C. Irby Company to expand to 38 22

- WHEREAS, Mr. Irby was a generous and benevolent man, giving 24
- much of his time and money to various community organizations and 25

- 28 on Capitol Street to Mississippi State University to use for its

- 32 Business Hall of Fame in 1992; and
