HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 112

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING CONGRESS TO SUPPORT THE 1 DEPLOYMENT OF A NATIONAL MISSILE DEFENSE SYSTEM. 2 3 WHEREAS, the 1972 Anti-Ballistic Missile (ABM) Treaty was 4 signed with a nation that no longer exists; and WHEREAS, an increasing number of nations, including North 5 Korea either currently possess the capability to launch missile 6 7 attacks against the United States or are working to obtain that 8 capability; and 9 WHEREAS, due in part to advances in technology, the possibility that a missile bearing a weapon of mass destruction 10 11 will be used against United States forces or interests is higher today than it was during most of the Cold War; and 12 WHEREAS, terrorist groups, not just states, may have the 13 means to buy intercontinental ballistic missiles; and 14 WHEREAS, the Cold War policy of "mutual assured destruction" 15 assumed in arms control treaties is not sufficient to deter 16 terrorist missile attacks; and 17 WHEREAS, defending against a missile attack is the 18 government's moral obligation: 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 20 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING 21 THEREIN, That we do urge Congress to support and vote in favor of 22 all efforts to build and deploy a national missile defense system 23 24 as soon as possible. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be 25 furnished to the Mississippi Congressional Delegation and to 26
