HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 117

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE CONGRESSIONAL 1 DELEGATION OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI TO SUPPORT LEGISLATION TO 2 3 PERMANENTLY REPEAL THE DEATH TAX PROVISIONS UNDER THE ECONOMIC 4 GROWTH AND TAX RELIEF RECONCILIATION ACT OF 2001. 5 WHEREAS, under the estate tax provisions of the Economic Growth and Tax Relief Reconciliation Act of 2001, the death tax 6 was temporarily phased out, not permanently eliminated; and 7 WHEREAS, women and minorities are very often owners of small 8 9 and medium-sized businesses, and the death tax prevents their children from reaping the rewards of a lifetime trying to make a 10 better life; and 11 WHEREAS, farmers and other small businesses will face losing 12 their farms and businesses if the federal government resumes the 13 heavy taxation of citizens at death; and 14 WHEREAS, employees suffer when they lose their jobs when 15 small and medium-sized businesses are liquidated to pay death 16 taxes and because high capital costs depress the number of new 17 businesses that could offer them a job; and 18 WHEREAS, if the estate tax had been repealed in 1996, over 19 the next nine years the U.S. economy would have averaged as much 20 as \$11 billion per year in extra output, and an average of 145,000 21 additional new jobs would have been created; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the persistent uncertainty created by the sunset provision prevents families and small businesses from taking 24 advantage of the temporary repeal; and 25 26 WHEREAS, having repeatedly passed both the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate, elimination of the death tax 27 has proven to hold wide bipartisan support; and 28 H.
