HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 35

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING MIKE MOORE FOR HIS OUTSTANDING AND 2 DEDICATED SERVICE AS ATTORNEY GENERAL FOR THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI 3 AND CONGRATULATING HIM UPON HIS RETIREMENT.

WHEREAS, an outstanding and loyal public servant, Attorney
General Mike Moore has labored as a public servant to the State of
Mississippi for twenty-five years; and

7 WHEREAS, General Moore began his career in public service as 8 an assistant district attorney in 1977 and in 1979, advanced to 9 become the state's youngest district attorney, a position he 10 retained until he was elected Attorney General in 1987; and

11 WHEREAS, General Moore has been supported by his wife, Tisha,12 and son, Kyle, throughout his many pursuits; and

13 WHEREAS, because he is one who is never afraid to fight for 14 what he believes to be right, Attorney General Moore filed the 15 first lawsuit against 13 tobacco companies in 1994, which gained 16 him national attention and made Mississippi the first state to 17 insist that cigarette manufacturers reimburse the state for costs 18 incurred for treating smoking-related illnesses; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the lawsuit, Mississippi received a settlement payment of \$4.1 billion, and following General Moore's lead, a \$240 billion settlement was reached covering other states; and

23 WHEREAS, General Moore serves as Chairman of the Partnership 24 for a Healthy Mississippi, an organization charged with combating 25 tobacco use among our state's youth that has seen a 30 percent 26 reduction in teen smoking rates during the Attorney General's

No. 35 03/HR07/R1884 PAGE 1 (GT\HS) 28 WHEREAS, General Moore has, in recent years, turned his 29 attention to helping young people in Mississippi by doubling the 30 number of Boys and Girls Clubs of America in our state, by 31 recruiting more than 5,000 mentors for young people in our state 32 through the Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Mississippi and the 33 Mississippi Mentoring Network; and

WHEREAS, many honors have been bestowed upon Attorney General 34 Mike Moore throughout his career, such as: in 1992, he was 35 selected the first resident Mississippian to become one of the Ten 36 Most Outstanding Young Americans; in 1994, his fellow Attorneys 37 General honored him with the prestigious Wyman Award, which named 38 him the most outstanding Attorney General in the nation; and, in 39 1998, he was recognized as "Lawyer of the Year" by the National 40 Law Journal and as "Public Official of the Year" by Governing 41 Magazine; and 42

WHEREAS, General Moore has brought honor to himself and to 43 44 our state by holding many distinguished positions, such as: 45 President of the National Association of Attorneys General; Chairman of the Mississippi Mentoring Network; Representative of 46 47 the National Association of Attorneys General for the Council of State Governments; Chairman of the Mississippi's Substance Abuse 48 49 Policy Council; Representative to the Advisory Board of the National Resource Center for Child Advocacy and Protection for the 50 National Association of Attorneys General; and board member for 51 52 the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, to name just a few of the many ways that he contributes his talents; and 53 54 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Legislature to recognize and pay tribute to a Mississippian who exemplifies the meaning of 55 dedicated public service and loyalty to our great state: 56 57 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby 58 59 commend Attorney General Mike Moore for his outstanding and
