HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 64

1 A RESOLUTION TO AMEND RULE 1 AND RULE 10A OF THE HOUSE RULES 2 TO ESTABLISH TERM LIMITATIONS FOR THE OFFICES OF SPEAKER AND 3 SPEAKER PRO TEMPORE OF THE HOUSE.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That Rule 1 of the 2000-2004 Rules of the House is amended as follows:

(1) The Speaker, when elected, shall hold office for a 7 1. 8 term of four (4) years, or until the next regular session of the Legislature following an election for Governor and members of the 9 Legislature, and shall take the chair on every legislative day 10 precisely at the hour to which the House shall have adjourned at 11 the last sitting, immediately call the members to order, cause the 12 13 roll to be called finally (late members may file explanations as late but present) and, on the appearance of a quorum, cause the 14 journal of the proceedings of the last day's sitting to be read, 15 having previously examined and approved the same. 16

(2) No person shall be elected to the Office of Speaker of 17 the House to serve for more than two (2) terms, and no person (a) 18 who has held the Office of Speaker or has acted as Speaker for 19 20 more than six (6) months of a term to which another person was 21 elected, or (b) who has been elected to the Office of Speaker for 22 the remainder of a term for which another person was first elected, shall be elected to the Office of Speaker to serve for 23 more than one (1) additional full term. The provisions of this 24 subsection shall not apply to any person elected to serve as 25

26 Speaker before December 31, 2002.

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That Rule 10A of the 2000-2004 Rules 28 of the House is amended as follows:

29 10A. (1) There is hereby created in the House of 30 Representatives the Office of Speaker Pro Tempore of the 31 Mississippi House of Representatives (hereinafter Speaker Pro 32 Tempore).

33 (2) The Speaker Pro Tempore shall be elected on the same day
34 and in the same manner and method as may be designated for the
35 election of the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

36 (3) (a) The Speaker Pro Tempore shall serve a term of four
37 (4) years, which term as Speaker Pro Tempore shall expire
38 concurrently with the term being served by the Speaker Pro Tempore
39 as a member of the House of Representatives.

(b) No person shall be elected to the Office of Speaker 40 Pro Tempore to serve for more than two (2) terms, and no person 41 (a) who has held the Office of Speaker Pro Tempore or has acted as 42 Speaker Pro Tempore for more than six (6) months of a term to 43 which another person was elected, or (b) has been elected to the 44 Office of Speaker Pro Tempore for the remainder of a term for 45 which another person was first elected, shall be elected to the 46 Office of Speaker Pro Tempore to serve for more than one (1) 47 48 additional full term. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any person elected to serve as Speaker Pro Tempore before 49 December 31, 2002. 50

51 Any vacancy in the Office of Speaker Pro Tempore (4)occurring during a regular or special legislative session shall be 52 filled by election of the House of Representatives within five (5) 53 calendar days after the vacancy occurs. Any vacancy occurring 54 55 during an interim between legislative sessions shall be filled 56 within the first five (5) calendar days of the next succeeding regular or special session. The person so elected shall serve 57 58 only the remainder of the unexpired term.

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59 (5) The Speaker Pro Tempore shall have the following powers,60 duties and responsibilities:

(a) To serve as Speaker of the House of Representatives
during the absence, illness or disability of the Speaker, thereby
assuming all powers, duties, responsibilities and privileges
conferred upon the Speaker by the Constitution, statute, law or
rule;

(b) To become Speaker of the House of Representatives
in the event of the death of the Speaker, thereby assuming all
powers, duties, responsibilities and privileges conferred upon the
Speaker by the Constitution, statute, law or rule. However, if
the Speaker Pro Tempore becomes the Speaker of the House, a new
Speaker Pro Tempore shall be elected;

(c) To preside over the House of Representatives when the Speaker is not presiding and to preside over the House when sitting as the Committee of the Whole unless the Speaker Pro Tempore moved that the House go into the Committee of the Whole;

76 (d) To serve as the Chairman of the House Management
77 Committee, having full powers of discussion, participation and
78 voting;

79 (e) To serve as an ex officio member of the Rules
80 Committee, having full powers of discussion, participation and
81 voting;

82 (f) To consult with the Speaker in resolving points of83 order or other parliamentary matters; and

84 (g) Such other powers, duties and responsibilities as
85 may be conferred upon the Speaker Pro Tempore by law or
86 legislative rule.
