5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	37-19-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
9	as the Mississippi "Teacher Opportunity Program (TOP)." The
10	allowance in the minimum education program and the Mississippi
11	Adequate Education Program for teachers' salaries in each county
12	and separate school district shall be determined and paid in

(i) Any licensed teacher who has met the requirements and acquired a Master Teacher certificate from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of Education as a teacher and not as an administrator. Such teacher shall submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State S. 260 eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 261 262 (ii) Any licensed school counselor who has met the 263 requirements and acquired a National Certified School Counselor (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified Counselors 264 265 and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of 266 Education as a counselor and not as an administrator. Such licensed school counselor shall submit documentation to the State 267 Department of Education that the endorsement was received prior to 268 269 October 15 in order to be eliqible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the licensed school counselor shall 270 271 submit such documentation to the State Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary 272 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 273 274 However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National 275 276 Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification process for a Master Teacher certificate for school counselors, 277 278 and any school counselor receiving the salary supplement will be required to complete the Master Teacher certificate process under 279 280 item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such 281 salary supplement. Any licensed speech-language pathologist and 282 (iii) 283 audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American 284 Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is employed by a local 285 286 school board. Such licensed speech-language pathologist and 287 audiologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of 288 Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary 289 290 supplement in the current school year, or the licensed speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such 291

documentation to the State Department of Education prior to 292 February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary 293 supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 294 295 However, the salary supplement authorized under this item shall be 296 discontinued two (2) years after the date on which the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards offers a certification 297 process for a Master Teacher certificate for school 298 299 speech-language pathologists and audiologists, and any school speech-language pathologist and audiologist receiving the salary 300 supplement will be required to complete the Master Teacher 301 302 certificate process under item (i) of this paragraph in order to continue receiving such salary supplement. 303 An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for 304 305 the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for 306 postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) 307 for a school counselor or speech-language pathologist and 308 309 audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in 310 the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of 311 completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement 312 313 for any employee of the school district described under paragraph (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the 314 school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the 315 316 process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing 317 the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an 318 employee, the local school district may agree to directly 319 320 reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the 321 employee. All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process 322 (C)

reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid

district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local supplement to which employees with similar training and experience otherwise are entitled.

(d) The State Department of Education may not pay any process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who does not complete the certification or endorsement process required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. If an employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a local school district or private individual or entity fails to complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or endorsement.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 345 and after July 1, 2003.
