- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-54-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
- 2 TO CLARIFY THAT APPLICANTS FOR A MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST
- 3 LICENSE MAY MEET EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS IN COURSEWORK
- 4 ACCREDITED BY CERTAIN ORGANIZATIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-54-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 73-54-17. Any person who applies for a license after
- 9 September 1, 2000, shall be issued a license by the board if he or
- 10 she meets the qualifications set forth in Section 73-54-13, and
- 11 submits the required application fees, and provides satisfactory
- 12 evidence to the board that he or she:
- 13 (a) Meets educational and experience qualifications as
- 14 follows:
- 15 (i) Holds a master's degree or doctoral degree in
- 16 marriage and family therapy from an institution of higher
- 17 education in a program that is accredited by the Commission on
- 18 Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education (COAMFTE)
- 19 or an equivalent accrediting organization, or that was in COAMFTE
- 20 candidacy status at the time of graduation and subsequently
- 21 received COAMFTE accreditation;
- 22 (ii) Following the receipt of the first qualifying
- 23 degree, has at least two (2) years of supervised experience in
- 24 marriage and family therapy, or its equivalent, acceptable to the
- 25 board, provided it meets, at a minimum, the requirements for
- 26 clinical membership in the American Association for Marriage and
- 27 Family Therapy;

28	(iii) Has completed at least one hundred (100)
29	hours of supervision of marriage and family therapy, as defined by
30	the board; and
31	(b) Passes an examination administered by the board.
