SENATE BILL NO. 2098

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1-1-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
PROVIDE THAT THE OFFICE OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF EACH PUBLIC
SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE SCHOOL BOARD ATTORNEY OF EACH PUBLIC
SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL BE PROVIDED A SET OF THE MISSISSIPPI CODE;
AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

7 SECTION 1. Section 1-1-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows:

9 1-1-11. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this 10 section, the Joint Committee on Compilation, Revision and 11 Publication of Legislation shall distribute or provide for the 12 distribution of the sets of the compilation of the Mississippi 13 Code of 1972 purchased by the state as follows:

14 Fifty-seven (57) sets to the Mississippi House of 15 Representatives and forty (40) sets to the Mississippi Senate for 16 the use of the Legislative Reference Bureau, Legislative Services 17 Offices, staffs and committees thereof.

Ten (10) sets to the Governor's Office; nine (9) sets to the 18 19 Secretary of State; and twenty (20) sets to the Auditor's Office. One (1) set to each of the following: the Lieutenant 20 Governor; each member of the Legislature; the Treasurer; each 21 22 district attorney; each county attorney; each judge of the Court of Appeals and each judge of the Supreme, circuit, chancery, 23 county, family, justice and municipal courts; each Mississippi 24 Senator and Mississippi Representative in Congress; State 25 Superintendent of Education; the office of the superintendent of 26 schools of each public school district; the school board attorney 27 of each public school district; Director of the Department of 28

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Finance and Administration; six (6) sets to the Performance 29 30 Evaluation and Expenditure Review (PEER) Committee, two (2) sets to the Director of the Legislative Budget Office; the Commissioner 31 of Agriculture and Commerce; each Mississippi Transportation 32 33 Commissioner; six (6) sets to the Department of Corrections; the 34 Insurance Commissioner; the Clerk of the Supreme Court; the State Board of Health; each circuit clerk; each chancery clerk in the 35 state for the use of the chancery clerk and the board of 36 supervisors; each sheriff in the state for the use of his office 37 and the county officers; and each county for the county library 38 39 (and an additional set shall be given to each circuit clerk, chancery clerk, sheriff and county library in counties having two 40 (2) judicial districts). 41

Two (2) sets to the Department of Archives and History; two 42 (2) sets to the State Soil and Water Conservation Commission; 43 sixty-eight (68) sets to the Attorney General's Office; six (6) 44 sets to the Public Service Commission; four (4) sets to the Public 45 Utilities Staff; thirty-six (36) sets to the State Tax Commission; 46 two (2) sets to the State Personnel Board; six (6) sets to the 47 48 State Law Library; one (1) set to the Library of Congress; ten (10) sets to the University of Mississippi Law School; one (1) set 49 50 each to the Mississippi School for the Deaf and the Mississippi School for the Blind; one (1) set each to the University of 51 Mississippi, Mississippi State University, Mississippi University 52 53 for Women, University of Southern Mississippi, Delta State University, Alcorn State University, Jackson State University, 54 55 Mississippi Valley State University, and the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning; and one (1) set to the 56 Supreme Court judges' conference room. In furtherance of the 57 State Library's reciprocal program of code exchange with libraries 58 of the several states, the joint committee shall, at the direction 59 60 and only upon the written request of the State Librarian,

One (1) set to each state junior or community college; three 63 (3) sets to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks; two 64 65 (2) sets to the Department of Environmental Quality; two (2) sets 66 to the Department of Marine Resources; two (2) sets to the Mississippi Ethics Commission; six (6) sets to the Mississippi 67 Workers' Compensation Commission; four (4) sets to the State 68 Department of Rehabilitation Services; and seven (7) sets to the 69 Department of Human Services. One (1) set to each of the 70 71 following: State Textbook Procurement Commission; University Medical Center; State Library Commission; Department of 72 73 Agriculture and Commerce; Forestry Commission; and seventeen (17) sets to the Department of Public Safety. Also, one (1) set to 74 75 each of the following: Adjutant General, Department of Economic and Community Development, Department of Banking and Consumer 76 Finance, Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, 77 78 the State Educational Finance Commission, the Mississippi Board of Vocational and Technical Education, Division of Medicaid, State 79 80 Board of Mental Health, and Department of Youth Services.

The joint committee is authorized to distribute or provide for the distribution of additional sets of the Mississippi Code, not to exceed three (3) sets, to the office of each district attorney for the use of his assistants.

The joint committee shall provide to the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate the annual supplements to the Mississippi Code of 1972 for each set of the code maintained by the House and Senate.

The set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 to be provided to each member of the Legislature shall be provided unless specifically waived by such legislator in writing.

An elected or appointed officeholder in the State ofMississippi, except for a member of the Legislature, shall deliver

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94 to his successor in office, or to the joint committee if there is 95 no successor, the set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 provided the 96 officeholder under this section.

97 Before the joint committee delivers or provides for delivery 98 of a copy of the Mississippi Code of 1972 to an individual 99 officeholder, the joint committee shall prepare and submit a written agreement to the officeholder. The agreement shall, among 100 other provisions, state that the code is the property of the State 101 of Mississippi, that it shall be transferred to the officeholder's 102 successor in office, that the officeholder has an obligation to 103 104 make such transfer and that the officeholder shall be responsible for the failure to deliver the code and for any damage or 105 106 destruction to the code, normal wear and tear excepted. The joint committee shall execute the agreement and forward it to the 107 officeholder for execution. The joint committee shall not deliver 108 or provide for delivery of the code to the officeholder until the 109 110 executed agreement is received by the committee. The joint 111 committee may include in the agreement such other provisions as it may deem reasonable and necessary. In addition to damages or any 112 113 other remedy for not transferring a set of the code to his successor, an officeholder who does not transfer his set of the 114 115 code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction, pay a fine of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Upon request of 116 the joint committee, the Attorney General shall assist the joint 117 118 committee in taking such actions as necessary to require an officeholder to transfer the set of code provided under this 119 120 section to his successor, or to the joint committee if there is no successor, and to recover reimbursement or damages from any 121 officeholder for the loss of or damage or destruction to any 122 volumes of the set of the code provided under this section, other 123 124 than normal wear and tear.

125 Replacement of missing, damaged or destroyed sets or volumes 126 of the code provided by this chapter may be obtained from the code

S. B. No. 2098 03/SS03/R39 PAGE 4 127 publisher through the joint committee at the established state 128 cost, the cost to be borne by the recipient.

No more than one (1) set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 shall be furnished to any one (1) individual, regardless of the office or offices he may hold.

(2) The joint committee, in its discretion, may determine whether electronic access to the Mississippi Code of 1972 is available and a sufficient substitute for actual bound volumes of the code and, if so, may omit furnishing any one or more sets otherwise required by this section.

137 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from138 and after July 1, 2003.
