COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2173

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-9-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ANY COUNTY TO PAY ITS 3 COUNTY COURT JUDGE A CERTAIN SALARY IN RELATION TO THAT PAID TO A 4 CIRCUIT JUDGE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 9-9-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

9-9-11. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (2) 8 9 and (3), the county court judge shall receive an annual salary payable monthly out of the county treasury in an amount not to 10 exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary which 11 is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery 12 judges of this state, in the discretion of the board of 13 supervisors of said county; provided, however, that the salary of 14 such judge shall not be reduced during his term of office. 15 Provided further, that the office of county court judge in any 16 county receiving an annual salary of Thirty-six Thousand Dollars 17 (\$36,000.00) or more shall be a full-time position, and the holder 18 thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law. 19

(2) In the event of the establishment of a county court by agreement between two (2) or more counties as provided in Section 9-9-3, the county judge of the court so established shall be paid a salary equal to one and one-half (1-1/2) times that salary that he would be paid if he were the judge of the smallest of such two (2) or more counties, such salary to be paid in monthly

installments as provided by law; provided that such salary shall not exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary of the circuit and chancery judges of this state.

(3) The county court judge shall receive an annual salarypayable monthly out of the county treasury as follows:

(a) In any county having a population of seventy
thousand (70,000) or more according to the 1980 federal census,
the county judge shall receive an annual salary of One Thousand
Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than that paid to a circuit court judge.
The office of county judge shall be a full-time position, and the
holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law.

(b) In any county having a population of sixty thousand 37 (60,000) or more but less than seventy thousand (70,000) according 38 to the 1980 federal census, the county judge shall receive an 39 annual salary of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00). The office 40 of county judge shall be a full-time position, and the holder 41 thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law. 42 The county judge shall not be eligible for any additional salary 43 except as may be authorized in subsection (4). 44

In any county having a population of twenty-seven 45 (C) 46 thousand (27,000) or more but less than sixty thousand (60,000) according to the 1980 federal census, the county judge shall 47 48 receive an annual salary of not less than Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00) but not more than Forty Thousand Dollars 49 (\$40,000.00), in the discretion of the board of supervisors of 50 The county judge shall not be eligible for any said county. 51 additional salary except as may be authorized in subsection (4). 52 53 In the event that the board of supervisors of said county elects to pay such county judge an annual salary of Thirty Thousand 54 Dollars (\$30,000.00) or more, the office of county judge shall be 55 a full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise 56 57 engage in the practice of law.

(d) In any county having a population of less than
twenty-seven thousand (27,000) according to the 1980 federal
census, the county judge shall receive an annual salary of not
less than Four Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$4,200.00) and not

62 more than Eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,500.00), in the 63 discretion of the board of supervisors of said county. The county 64 judge shall not be eligible for any additional salary except as 65 may be authorized in subsection (4).

(4) The county judge of any county described in this
subsection shall be paid the compensation, and he shall be subject
to any restrictions, set forth in the following paragraphs:

The county judge of any such Class 1 county with 69 (a) population according to the latest federal decennial census of 70 forty-five thousand (45,000) or more and lying wholly within a 71 72 levee district and having two (2) judicial districts shall, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of such county, receive an 73 annual salary not exceeding Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), 74 75 or a sum which is One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the 76 salary which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and 77 chancery judges of the state, whichever is greater.

The county judge of any Class 1 county having an 78 (b) area in excess of nine hundred twenty-five (925) square miles 79 shall receive an annual salary of not less than Thirty Thousand 80 81 Dollars (\$30,000.00) but, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of such county, such salary may be not more than Five 82 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) less than the annual salary of a circuit 83 judge, payable monthly out of the county treasury, and the county 84 judge shall not practice law. 85

86 (C) The office of county judge in any such Class 1 county with a population according to the 1970 federal decennial 87 census of greater than thirty-nine thousand (39,000), and where 88 U.S. Highway 61 and Mississippi Highway 6 intersect, shall receive 89 an annual salary to be paid in monthly installments of not less 90 than an amount equal to ninety percent (90%) of the annual salary 91 which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and 92 93 chancery judges of the state, as follows: The salary of the county judge shall be increased by ten percent (10%) annually 94

95 above the base salary of the preceding year until such time as the 96 judge's salary is equal to the amount that is provided by this 97 subsection. The office of county judge shall be a full-time 98 position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the 99 practice of law.

In any Class 1 county bordering on the Mississippi 100 (d) 101 River and which has situated therein a national military park and national military cemetery, the office of county judge shall be a 102 full-time position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise 103 engage in the practice of law. The salary for the county judge in 104 105 said county shall be fixed at a sum which is One Thousand Dollars 106 (\$1,000.00) less than the salary which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery judges of this state. 107

108 (e) The county judge in any county having a population of at least forty-two thousand one hundred eleven (42,111), 109 according to the 1970 census, and where U.S. Highway 49E and U.S. 110 Highway 82 intersect, shall receive an annual salary to be paid in 111 112 monthly installments of not less than Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) but not more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars 113 114 (\$2,500.00) less than the annual salary of the circuit judge, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of that county. 115

116 (f) The county judge in any Class 1 county bordering on the Mississippi River and having an area of less than four hundred 117 fifty (450) square miles wherein U.S. Highways 84 and 61 intersect 118 119 shall receive an annual salary of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) less than the annual salary of a circuit judge, and 120 121 such county judge shall not practice law in any manner. The county judge in such county shall not be eligible to receive any 122 additional salary authorized by this section or from any other 123 124 source other than that set out and authorized by this paragraph. The county judge of any Class 1 county bordering on 125 (q)

126 the Mississippi River on the west and the State of Tennessee on 127 the north, and traversed north to south by Interstate Highway 55,

S. B. No. 2173 03/SS02/R207CS PAGE 4 128 shall receive an annual salary of ninety percent (90%) of the 129 salary which is now or shall hereafter be provided for chancery 130 and circuit judges of this state, but in any event not less than 131 Sixty Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$60,200.00).

132 (h) The county judge of any Class 1 county with a population of greater than sixty-nine thousand (69,000) according 133 to the 1980 federal decennial census, and wherein U.S. Highway 80 134 and Mississippi Highway 43 intersect, shall receive an annual 135 136 salary in an amount not greater than the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) less than the salary which is now or shall 137 138 hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery judges of this state, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of that 139 140 county.

(i) The county judge of any county having a population 141 in excess of sixty-six thousand (66,000) according to the 1980 142 federal decennial census, wherein is located a state-supported 143 university and in which U.S. Highways 49 and 11 intersect, shall 144 145 receive an annual salary of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than that paid to a circuit court judge. The office of such 146 147 county judge shall be a full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law. 148

149 (j) The county judge of any county having two (2) 150 judicial districts, having a population in excess of sixty-one thousand nine hundred (61,900) according to the 1980 federal 151 152 decennial census, in which U.S. Interstate Highway 59 intersects with U.S. Highway 84, shall receive an annual salary of One 153 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary which is now or 154 155 hereafter authorized to be paid circuit and chancery court judges of this state. The office of such county judge shall be a 156 full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise 157 engage in the practice of law. 158

159 (k) The office of county judge of any Class I county160 wherein U.S. Highway 51 and U.S. Highway 98 intersect shall be a

161 full-time position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise 162 engage in the practice of law. The annual salary for the office 163 of county judge in said county may be fixed, in the discretion of 164 the board of supervisors of said county, at a sum not to exceed 165 Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) less than the salary which is now 166 or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery judges of 167 this state.

The county judge of any county having a population 168 (1)of more than forty-one thousand six hundred (41,600) but less than 169 forty-one thousand six hundred fifty (41,650) according to the 170 171 1980 federal census, and wherein U.S. Highway 49 intersects with Mississippi Highway 22, shall receive an annual salary in an 172 173 amount established by the board of supervisors, but in no event to 174 exceed the salary provided now or hereafter for circuit and chancery judges of this state. 175

The county judge of any county having a population 176 (m) of more than fifty-seven thousand (57,000) but less than 177 fifty-seven thousand one hundred (57,100) according to the 1980 178 federal census, wherein U.S. Highway 45 intersects with 179 180 Mississippi Highway 6, shall receive an annual salary in an amount established by the board of supervisors, but in no event to exceed 181 182 the salary provided now or hereafter for circuit and chancery 183 judges of this state.

The county judge of any county having a population 184 (n) 185 of more than fifty-seven thousand three hundred (57,300) according to the 1980 federal decennial census, wherein is located a 186 187 state-supported university and wherein United States Highways 82 and 45 intersect, shall receive an annual salary in an amount 188 established by the board of supervisors, but in no event to exceed 189 the salary provided now or hereafter for circuit and chancery 190 191 judges of this state.

192 (5) The salary of a county court judge or justice court193 judge shall not be reduced during his term of office as a result

194 of a population decrease based upon the 1990 federal decennial 195 census.

(6) The salary of a sheriff shall not be reduced during his
term of office as a result of a population decrease based upon the
198 1990 federal decennial census.

Notwithstanding any provision of this section to the 199 (7) contrary, the board of supervisors of any county, in its 200 discretion, may pay its county court judge an annual salary of One 201 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than that paid to a circuit 202 The office of county judge shall be a full-time 203 court judge. 204 position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law. 205

SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, or October 1, 2003, whichever occurs later.
