AN ACT TO CREATE AND EMPOWER THE MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON 1 HUMAN RIGHTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 **SECTION 1.** (1) (a) There is hereby created the Mississippi Commission on Human Rights. The commission shall be composed of 5 thirteen (13) members to be appointed as follows: 6 7 (i) Five (5) members shall be appointed by the 8 Governor. 9 (ii) Five (5) members shall be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. 10 11 (iii) Three (3) members shall be appointed by the Attorney General. 12 The members of the commission shall be women and (b) 13 men of recognized ability and achievement who are representative 14 of the ethnic and cultural diversity of the population of this 15 state. Members shall serve for terms of four (4) years each, and 16 no member may serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms. All 17 vacancies shall be filled by the appointing authority for the 18 unexpired term. 19 20 (C) The commission shall elect a chairman, vice chairman and secretary from among its members for terms of two (2) 21 22 years each, and any member is eligible for successive elections to 23 office. A quorum for transacting business shall be a 24 (d) 25 majority of the members of the commission. (e) Members of the commission shall be reimbursed for 26 expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, 27 S. B. No. 2179 G1/2 03/SS03/R436 PAGE 1

and shall receive per diem as provided in Section 25-3-69,Mississippi Code of 1972.

30 (f) The Lieutenant Governor and the Attorney General
31 shall notify the Governor after they have made their appointments,
32 and the Governor shall then designate a place and time for the
33 initial organizational meeting of the commission.

34 (2) The commission shall have the powers and authority
35 necessary to carry out the duties imposed upon it by this act,
36 including, but not limited to, the following:

37 (a) To employ such administrative, technical and other
38 personnel as may be necessary for the performance of its powers
39 and duties;

40 (b) To hold hearings, make and sign any agreements and 41 do or perform any acts which may be necessary, desirable or proper 42 to carry out the purposes of this act;

(c) To cooperate with any state agency, authority,
board, commission, department or institution to facilitate its
implementation of the powers and duties granted to the commission
in this act; and each such state agency, authority, board,
commission, department or institution shall cooperate with the
commission in the performance of its duties;

(d) To appoint advisers or advisory committees, from
time to time, when the commission determines that the experience
or expertise of such advisers or advisory committees is needed for
projects of the commission; and

(e) To apply for and accept funds, grants, gifts and services from the state, the government of the United States or any of its agencies, or any other public or private source, for the purpose of defraying clerical and administrative costs as may be necessary in carrying out its duties under this act.

(3) (a) The commission shall study the following:
(i) Educational and employment problems, needs and

political rights of women, including pensions, tax requirements,
property rights, marriage and dissolution of marriage provisions,
and similar matters;

(iii) The effect of social attitudes and pressuresand economic considerations in shaping public policy; and

67 (iv) Any laws, practices or conditions which
68 impose special limitations or burdens upon women, minorities or
69 society, or which limit or tend to limit available opportunities.

(b) The commission shall act as an information center
on the status of human rights, educational, employment and other
related needs.

(c) The commission shall recommend, develop, prepare or coordinate materials, projects or other activities and shall give technical and consultative advice to public or private groups or persons concerned with any of the following:

77 (i) Preventing or minimizing problems brought78 about by the changing roles and responsibilities; and

79 (ii) Developing programs to encourage and enable80 all persons to be fully contributing members of society.

(d) The commission may encourage organizations and
other groups to institute local self-help activities designed to
meet educational, employment and related needs.

84 (4) The commission shall make a report to the Legislature at
85 the close of each fiscal year on its activities, findings and
86 recommendations.

87 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 88 and after July 1, 2003.
