## SENATE BILL NO. 2219

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 45-3-51, 45-9-131, 49-1-14 AND 49-15-22, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE FAMILY OF A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY MAY RETAIN HIS SIDEARM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 45-3-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

45-3-51. Each member of the Mississippi Highway Safety 8 9 Patrol or agent of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics who retires 10 under the Highway Safety Patrol Retirement System or the Public Employees' Retirement System, for superannuation or for reason of 11 disability shall be allowed to retain, as his personal property, 12 one (1) sidearm which was issued under authority of Section 13 45-3-19 or 41-29-159. If a member is killed while engaged in the 14 performance of his law enforcement duties after January 1, 2002, 15 16 his next of kin shall be allowed to retain the member's sidearm.

SECTION 2. Section 45-9-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

45-9-131. Upon approval of the governing authorities of the 19 municipality or county, a member of any municipal or county law 20 enforcement agency who retires under any state retirement system 21 or any state-approved retirement system may be allowed to purchase 22 as his personal property one (1) sidearm which was issued to him 23 by the law enforcement agency from which he retired. The 24 governing authorities of the municipality or county shall 25 26 determine the amount to be paid for the firearm by the retiring member of the law enforcement agency. If a member is killed while 27 engaged in the performance of his law enforcement duties after 28

January 1, 2002, his next of kin shall be allowed to retain the 29

30 member's sidearm.

SECTION 3. Section 49-1-14, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 31 amended as follows: 32

33 49-1-14. Each person employed as a conservation officer by 34 the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks who retires for superannuation or for reason of disability under the Public 35 Employees' Retirement System may, upon his request, be allowed to 36 retain, as his personal property, one (1) side arm which was 37 issued to him, during his service, provided funds are available 38 for such purpose. If a conservation officer is killed while 39 engaged in the performance of his law enforcement duties after 40 January 1, 2002, his next of kin shall be allowed to retain the 41 member's sidearm. 42

Section 49-15-22, Mississippi Code of 1972, is SECTION 4. 43 amended as follows: 44

Each person employed as a marine patrol officer by 45 49-15-22. the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources who retires for 46 superannuation or for reason of disability under the Public 47 48 Employees' Retirement System may, upon his request, be allowed to retain, as his personal property, one (1) side arm which was 49 issued to him during his service, if funds are available for this 50 If a marine patrol officer is killed while engaged in 51 purpose. the performance of his law enforcement duties after January 1, 52 2002, his next of kin shall be allowed to retain the member's 53 54 sidearm.

This act shall take effect and be in force from 55 SECTION 5. 56 and after its passage.
