## SENATE BILL NO. 2284

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-9-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CHANGE THE YEAR OF FEDERAL CENSUS WHICH IS USED AS A BASIS FOR COMPENSATION OF COUNTY COURT JUDGES IN CERTAIN COUNTIES; AND FOR
- 4 RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 9-9-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 8 9-9-11. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (2)
- 9 and (3), the county court judge shall receive an annual salary
- 10 payable monthly out of the county treasury in an amount not to
- 11 exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary which
- 12 is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery
- 13 judges of this state, in the discretion of the board of
- 14 supervisors of said county; provided, however, that the salary of
- 15 such judge shall not be reduced during his term of office.
- 16 Provided further, that the office of county court judge in any
- 17 county receiving an annual salary of Thirty-six Thousand Dollars
- 18 (\$36,000.00) or more shall be a full-time position, and the holder
- 19 thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law.
- 20 (2) In the event of the establishment of a county court by
- 21 agreement between two (2) or more counties as provided in Section
- 9-9-3, the county judge of the court so established shall be paid
- 23 a salary equal to one and one-half (1-1/2) times that salary that
- 24 he would be paid if he were the judge of the smallest of such two
- 25 (2) or more counties, such salary to be paid in monthly
- 26 installments as provided by law; provided that such salary shall
- 27 not exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary
- 28 of the circuit and chancery judges of this state.

- 29 (3) The county court judge shall receive an annual salary 30 payable monthly out of the county treasury as follows:
- 31 (a) In any county having a population of seventy
- 32 thousand (70,000) or more according to the 2000 federal census,
- 33 the county judge shall receive an annual salary of One Thousand
- 34 Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than that paid to a circuit court judge.
- 35 The office of county judge shall be a full-time position, and the
- 36 holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law.
- 37 (b) In any county having a population of sixty thousand
- 38 (60,000) or more but less than seventy thousand (70,000) according
- 39 to the 2000 federal census, the county judge shall receive an
- 40 annual salary of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00). The office
- 41 of county judge shall be a full-time position, and the holder
- 42 thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law. The
- 43 county judge shall not be eligible for any additional salary
- 44 except as may be authorized in subsection (4).
- 45 (c) In any county having a population of twenty-seven
- 46 thousand (27,000) or more but less than sixty thousand (60,000)
- 47 according to the 1980 federal census, the county judge shall
- 48 receive an annual salary of not less than Twelve Thousand Dollars
- 49 (\$12,000.00) but not more than Forty Thousand Dollars
- 50 (\$40,000.00), in the discretion of the board of supervisors of
- 51 said county. The county judge shall not be eligible for any
- 52 additional salary except as may be authorized in subsection (4).
- 53 In the event that the board of supervisors of said county elects
- 54 to pay such county judge an annual salary of Thirty Thousand
- 55 Dollars (\$30,000.00) or more, the office of county judge shall be
- 56 a full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise
- 57 engage in the practice of law.
- 58 (d) In any county having a population of less than
- 59 twenty-seven thousand (27,000) according to the 1980 federal
- 60 census, the county judge shall receive an annual salary of not
- 61 less than Four Thousand Two Hundred Dollars (\$4,200.00) and not

- 62 more than Eight Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,500.00), in the
- 63 discretion of the board of supervisors of said county. The county
- 64 judge shall not be eligible for any additional salary except as
- 65 may be authorized in subsection (4).
- 66 (4) The county judge of any county described in this
- 67 subsection shall be paid the compensation, and he shall be subject
- 68 to any restrictions, set forth in the following paragraphs:
- 69 (a) The county judge of any such Class 1 county with
- 70 population according to the latest federal decennial census of
- 71 forty-five thousand (45,000) or more and lying wholly within a
- 72 levee district and having two (2) judicial districts shall, in the
- 73 discretion of the board of supervisors of such county, receive an
- 74 annual salary not exceeding Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00),
- 75 or a sum which is One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the
- 76 salary which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and
- 77 chancery judges of the state, whichever is greater.
- 78 (b) The county judge of any Class 1 county having an
- 79 area in excess of nine hundred twenty-five (925) square miles
- 80 shall receive an annual salary of not less than Thirty Thousand
- 81 Dollars (\$30,000.00) but, in the discretion of the board of
- 82 supervisors of such county, such salary may be not more than Five
- 83 Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) less than the annual salary of a circuit
- 84 judge, payable monthly out of the county treasury, and the county
- 85 judge shall not practice law.
- 86 (c) The office of county judge in any such Class 1
- 87 county with a population according to the 1970 federal decennial
- 88 census of greater than thirty-nine thousand (39,000), and where
- 89 U.S. Highway 61 and Mississippi Highway 6 intersect, shall receive
- 90 an annual salary to be paid in monthly installments of not less
- 91 than an amount equal to ninety percent (90%) of the annual salary
- 92 which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and
- 93 chancery judges of the state, as follows: The salary of the
- 94 county judge shall be increased by ten percent (10%) annually

95 above the base salary of the preceding year until such time as the

96 judge's salary is equal to the amount that is provided by this

97 subsection. The office of county judge shall be a full-time

98 position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the

99 practice of law.

100 (d) In any Class 1 county bordering on the Mississippi

101 River and which has situated therein a national military park and

102 national military cemetery, the office of county judge shall be a

103 full-time position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise

104 engage in the practice of law. The salary for the county judge in

said county shall be fixed at a sum which is One Thousand Dollars

(\$1,000.00) less than the salary which is now or shall hereafter

107 be provided for circuit and chancery judges of this state.

108 (e) The county judge in any county having a population

109 of at least forty-two thousand one hundred eleven (42,111),

110 according to the 1970 census, and where U.S. Highway 49E and U.S.

111 Highway 82 intersect, shall receive an annual salary to be paid in

112 monthly installments of not less than Thirty Thousand Dollars

113 (\$30,000.00) but not more than Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars

(\$2,500.00) less than the annual salary of the circuit judge, in

115 the discretion of the board of supervisors of said county.

(f) The county judge in any Class 1 county bordering on

117 the Mississippi River and having an area of less than four hundred

118 fifty (450) square miles wherein U.S. Highways 84 and 61 intersect

119 shall receive an annual salary of Four Thousand Dollars

120 (\$4,000.00) less than the annual salary of a circuit judge, and

121 such county judge shall not practice law in any manner. The

122 county judge in such county shall not be eligible to receive any

123 additional salary authorized by this section or from any other

124 source other than that set out and authorized by this paragraph.

126 (g) The county judge of any Class 1 county with a

127 population of greater than sixty-nine thousand (69,000) according

to the 1980 federal decennial census, and wherein U.S. Highway 80 and Mississippi Highway 43 intersect, shall receive an annual salary in an amount not greater than the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) less than the salary which is now or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery judges of this state, in the discretion of the board of supervisors of said county.

(h) The county judge of any county having a population in excess of sixty-six thousand (66,000) according to the 1980 federal decennial census, wherein is located a state-supported university and in which U.S. Highways 49 and 11 intersect, shall receive an annual salary of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than that paid to a circuit court judge. The office of such county judge shall be a full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law.

(i) The county judge of any county having two (2) judicial districts, having a population in excess of sixty-one thousand nine hundred (61,900) according to the 1980 federal decennial census, in which U.S. Interstate Highway 59 intersects with U.S. Highway 84, shall receive an annual salary of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) less than the salary which is now or hereafter authorized to be paid circuit and chancery court judges of this state. The office of such county judge shall be a full-time position, and the holder thereof shall not otherwise engage in the practice of law.

(j) The office of county judge of any Class I county
wherein U.S. Highway 51 and U.S. Highway 98 intersect shall be a

full-time position and the holder thereof shall not otherwise
engage in the practice of law. The annual salary for the office
of county judge in said county may be fixed, in the discretion of
the board of supervisors of said county, at a sum not to exceed

Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) less than the salary which is now

- or shall hereafter be provided for circuit and chancery judges of this state.
- 162 (k) The county judge of any county having a population
- of more than forty-one thousand six hundred (41,600) but less than
- 164 forty-one thousand six hundred fifty (41,650) according to the
- 165 1980 federal census, and wherein U.S. Highway 49 intersects with
- 166 Mississippi Highway 22, shall receive an annual salary in an
- 167 amount established by the board of supervisors, but in no event to
- 168 exceed the salary provided now or hereafter for circuit and
- 169 chancery judges of this state.
- 170 (1) The county judge of any county having a population
- of more than fifty-seven thousand (57,000) but less than
- 172 fifty-seven thousand one hundred (57,100) according to the 1980
- 173 federal census, wherein U.S. Highway 45 intersects with
- 174 Mississippi Highway 6, shall receive an annual salary in an amount
- 175 established by the board of supervisors, but in no event to exceed
- 176 the salary provided now or hereafter for circuit and chancery
- 177 judges of this state.
- 178 (m) The county judge of any county having a population
- 179 of more than fifty-seven thousand three hundred (57,300) according
- 180 to the 1980 federal decennial census, wherein is located a
- 181 state-supported university and wherein United States Highways 82
- 182 and 45 intersect, shall receive an annual salary in an amount
- 183 established by the board of supervisors, but in no event to exceed
- 184 the salary provided now or hereafter for circuit and chancery
- 185 judges of this state.
- 186 (5) The salary of a county court judge or justice court
- 187 judge shall not be reduced during his term of office as a result
- 188 of a population decrease based upon the 1990 federal decennial
- 189 census.
- 190 (6) The salary of a sheriff shall not be reduced during his
- 191 term of office as a result of a population decrease based upon the
- 192 1990 federal decennial census.

193	(7) From and after October 1, 1993, or the effective date of
194	this act [Laws, 1993, Chapter 550], whichever is later, in
195	addition to the salaries set forth in this section, the board of
196	supervisors of any county, in its discretion, may pay any county
197	court judge whose salary is not established herein in relation to
198	the salary paid to chancery and circuit court judges, an
199	additional amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the maximum
200	allowable salary for that judge.
201	SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
202	shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting

Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, or October 1, 2003,
