SENATE BILL NO. 2304

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-1-77, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE DEADLINE BY WHICH THE STATE AUDITOR MUST FILE ANNUALLY 3 WITH THE LEGISLATURE A REPORT ON STATE-OWNED VEHICLES; AND FOR 4 RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-1-77, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 25-1-77. (1) No state department, institution or agency 9 shall purchase any motor vehicle, regardless of the source of funds from which the motor vehicle is to be purchased, except 10 under authority granted by the Department of Finance and 11 Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration 12 shall promulgate rules and regulations governing the purchase of 13 any motor vehicle by a state department, institution or agency 14 with regard to the appropriateness of the vehicle to its intended 15 use. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not grant 16 authority to purchase a motor vehicle which is not the most 17 appropriate vehicle type for its intended use unless specifically 18 approved by the Legislature. 19

It is not the intent of the Legislature for the 20 (2)Department of Finance and Administration to determine the 21 sufficient number of motor vehicles needed by each state 22 department, institution or agency, but to regulate the purchase so 23 that the vehicle is the most appropriate type for its intended 24 use. Further, it is the intent of the Legislature that any motor 25 26 vehicle purchased shall be made with due concern for economical and efficient use, but shall also meet the needs of the 27 department, institution or agency. agency shall maintain proper documentation signed by the executive 29 director which provides the intended use of the vehicle and the 30 basis for choosing the vehicle. Such documentation shall show 31 that the department, institution or agency made reasonable efforts 32 33 to purchase a vehicle that is economical and appropriate for its intended use. All such documentation shall be maintained and made 34 available for review by the State Auditor and any other reviewing 35 36 agency.

(3) The State Auditor shall make on-site visits and conduct
audits necessary to ensure the intent of this section. On or
before <u>September</u> 1 of each year, the State Auditor shall prepare
and deliver to the Senate and House Fees, Salaries and
Administration Committees and the Joint Legislative Budget
Committee a report containing any irregularities that he finds
concerning purchases of state-owned vehicles.

44 **SECTION 2**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 45 and after its passage.
